Hello,

I am a Floridian writing to the PSC regarding Docket Number 20200181.

The PSC needs to make the following updates to FEECA to improve energy efficiency for Florida utilities, all of which currently rank close to last in the nation:

- 1. Remove the Ratepayer Impact Measurement (RIM) Test from the cost/benefit analysis. No other utility regulation in our nation primarily relies on such a test as it allows utilities to exclude almost any energy efficiency program from implementation.
- 2. Remove the 2-year payback test for exclusion of consideration of total technical energy efficiency saving possibilities that could be made in Florida. No other state does this as it shortchanges our communities on the possible energy efficiency improvements that could be made in our state.
- 3. Specifically focus on rental property energy efficiency improvements when calculating energy efficiency potential and target implementation of programs to rental properties and Low-Income communities.
- 4. Set reasonable goals (i.e. the national average) for energy efficiency. The goals set in the last round ranged from 0.03 to 0.33%, far below the national average of 0.72%.
- 5. Enforce the goals set to improve energy efficiency. Even the low goals set by the most recent FEECA proceedings were not met by FPL or Duke Energy, with no repercussions.
