**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S
FIRST REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF
CERTAIN INFORMATION PROVIDED IN ITS RESPONSES TO VOTE SOLAR'S
FIRST REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS NOS. 10, 42 AND 43**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby submits its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification for certain information provided in its responses to The CLEO Institute and Vote Solar's ("Vote Solar") First Request for Production of Documents, Nos. 10, 42 and 43 (the "Confidential Information"). In support of its Request, FPL states as follows:

1. On June 8, 2021, FPL filed a Request for Confidential Classification of the Confidential Information (Document No. 04607-2021). By Order No. PSC-2021-0350-CFO-EI issued September 15, 2021, the Commission granted FPL's June 8, 2021 Request for Confidential Classification. FPL herein adopts and incorporates by reference the June 8, 2021 Request and Commission Order No. PSC-2021-0350-CFO-EI.

2. The period of confidential treatment granted by Order No. PSC-2021-0350-CFO-EI will expire on March 15, 2023. The Confidential Information that was the subject of FPL's June 8, 2021 Request and Order No. PSC-2021-0350-CFO-EI warrants continued treatment as proprietary and confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3). Accordingly, FPL hereby submits this First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

3. All of the information designated in Exhibits A and B to the June 8, 2021 Request remains confidential. Accordingly, those exhibits will not be reproduced or reattached here.

4. Regarding First Revised Exhibit C, all of the information listed in the June 8, 2021 Request remains confidential; the Exhibit is revised only to identify Thomas Allain as a new declarant, who is sponsoring information that was previously sponsored by Michael Spoor.

5. Also included is First Revised Exhibit D, which consists of the declaration of Thomas Allain.

6. The Confidential Information is intended to be and has been treated by FPL as private, its confidentiality has been maintained, and its disclosure would cause harm to FPL and its customers. Pursuant to Section 366.093, Fla. Stat., such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

7. As stated in FPL's June 8, 2021 Request and as described in the declaration included as First Revised Exhibit D, the Confidential Information consists of security measures, as well as information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of FPL. Specifically, some information is data provided by a third-party vendor which is proprietary to the vendor and cannot be released without its consent, other information contains response plans for a transmission outage which is confidential for security purposes. This information is protected by Sections 366.093(3)(c) and (e), Fla. Stat.

8. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information is proprietary confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a period of at least eighteen (18) months and should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See § 399.093(4), Fla. Stat.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and declarations, FPL respectfully requests that its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.

1. My name is Thomas Allain. I am currently employed by Florida Power & Light Company (“FPL”) as Director, Regulatory and Compliance, Power Delivery. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated in this written declaration.

2. I have reviewed the documents referenced and incorporated in FPL’s First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification for certain information provided in its responses to Vote Solar’s First Request for Production of Documents Nos. 10, 42 and 43. The documents or materials that I have reviewed and which are asserted by FPL to be proprietary confidential business information contain information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of FPL, as well as information describing security measures, systems, or procedures. Specifically, some information is data provided by a third-party vendor which is proprietary to the vendor and cannot be released without its consent, other information contains response plans for a transmission outage which is confidential for security purposes. To the best of my knowledge, FPL has maintained the confidentiality of these documents and materials.

3. Confidential treatment of the above-described information was granted by Commission Order No. PSC-2021-0350-CFO-EI issued September 15, 2021. Nothing has occurred since that time to change the confidential nature of this information and, as such, these materials should remain confidential for a period of not less than 18 months. In addition, they should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business so that FPL can continue to maintain the confidentiality of these documents.
