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25-30.0371 Acquisition Adjustments.
(1) Definitions. For the purpose of this rule, an acquisition adjustment is defined as the
(a) "Acquisition Adjustment" means the difference between the purchase price of utility
system assets to an acquiring utility and the net book value of the utility assets. A positive
acquisition adjustment exists when the purchase price is greater than the net book value. A
negative acquisition adjustment exists when the purchase price is less than the net book value
(b) "Positive Acquisition Adjustment" means the purchase price is greater than the net
book value.
(c) "Negative Acquisition Adjustment" means the purchase price is less than the net book
value.
(d) "Non-Viable Utility" means a utility that is:
1. in violation of statutory or regulatory primary water quality standards that affect the
quality of service provided and is not reasonably expected to furnish and maintain safe and
adequate service and facilities in the future; or
2. in violation of any order of a state or federal agency, including the Commission,
concerning the quality of service and is not reasonably expected to furnish and maintain safe
and adequate service and facilities in the future; or;
3. not reasonably expected to furnish and maintain safe and adequate service and facilities
in the future; or
4. insolvent, i.e., unable to pay debts owed.
(2) Positive Acquisition Adjustments for a Non-Viable Utility. A positive acquisition
adjustment shall not be included in rate base absent proof of extraordinary circumstances. An
entity that believes a A full or partial positive acquisition adjustment will be allowed for a
non-viable system if it is demonstrated that customers will benefit if a full or partial positive
acquisition adjustment is allowed should be made has the burden to prove the existence of CODING: Words <u>underlined</u> are additions; words in struck through type are deletions from existing law.

1 extraordinary circumstances. In determining whether customers benefit, extraordinary 2 circumstances have been demonstrated, the Commission will shall consider evidence provided 3 to the Commission such as anticipated improvements in quality of service, anticipated 4 improvements in compliance with regulatory mandates, anticipated rate reductions or rate 5 stability over a long-term period, anticipated cost efficiencies, and whether the purchase was made as part of an arms-length transaction. Amortization of a positive acquisition adjustment 6 7 will shall be pursuant to subsection (6) paragraph (4)(a) below. (3) Positive Acquisition Adjustments for a Viable Utility. A full or partial positive 8 9 acquisition adjustment will be allowed if it is demonstrated that the transaction incorporating the full or partial positive acquisition adjustment is projected to provide a positive cumulative 10 11 present value of the revenue requirements (CPVRR) benefit over a five-year period. All data 12 and assumptions used in such CPVRR analysis, including the spreadsheet with formulas intact used to calculate the CPVRR, must be provided in the application requesting a full or partial 13 14 positive acquisition adjustment. Form PSC XXXX (XX/23), entitled "Water and/or 15 Wastewater Utilities Cumulative Present Value of the Revenue Requirements for Acquisition Adjustment Worksheet," which is incorporated by reference in this rule and is available at 16 17 <hyperlink>, is an example CVPRR that may be completed by the applicant and included in 18 the application required by subsection (4) of this rule. This form may also be obtained from 19 the Commission's website, www.floridapsc.com. Negative Acquisition Adjustments. If the 20 purchase price is greater than 80 percent of net book value, a negative acquisition adjustment will not be included in rate base. When the purchase price is equal to or less than 80 percent of 21 22 net book value, a negative acquisition adjustment shall be included in rate base and will be 23 equal to 80 percent of net book value less the purchase price. Amortization of a negative 24 acquisition adjustment shall be pursuant to subparagraph (4)(b)1. or (4)(b)2. below. 25 (4) Application. Application for a full or partial positive acquisition adjustment can be CODING: Words underlined are additions; words in struck through type are deletions from existing law.

1	made at the time of transfer of ownership or at any time within three years of the date of the
2	order approving of the transfer of ownership and assets.
3	(5) Negative Acquisition Adjustment. A negative acquisition adjustment will not be
4	included in rate base.
5	(6) (4) Amortization Period. (a) In setting the amortization period for a Commission
6	approved positive acquisition adjustment pursuant to subsections (2) or (3) above, the
7	Commission will shall consider evidence such as the composite remaining life of the assets
8	purchased and the condition of the assets purchased. Amortization of the acquisition
9	adjustment will shall-begin on the date of issuance of the order approving the acquistion
10	adjustment-transfer of assets.
11	(b) The appropriate period over which to amortize a Commission approved negative
12	acquisition adjustment pursuant to subsection (3) above, shall be determined as follows:
13	1. If the purchase price is greater than 50 percent of net book value, the negative
14	acquisition adjustment shall be amortized over a 7-year period from the date of issuance of the
15	order approving the transfer of assets. In this case, the negative acquisition adjustment shall
16	not be recorded on the books for ratemaking purposes or used for any earnings review unless
17	the purchaser files for a rate increase pursuant to Section 367.081(2), 367.0814, 367.0817 or
18	367.0822, F.S., that will be effective during the amortization period.
19	2. If the purchase price is 50 percent of net book value or less, the negative acquisition
20	adjustment shall be amortized from the date of issuance of the order approving the transfer of
21	assets as follows:
22	a. 50 percent of the negative acquisition adjustment shall be amortized over a 7-year
23	period; and
24	b. 50 percent of the negative acquisition adjustment shall be amortized over the remaining
25	life of the assets.
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1	(7) (5) Subsequent Modification. Any full or partial positive acquisition adjustment, once
2	made by the Commission pursuant to subsections (2) or (3) above, may be subsequently
3	modified if the <u>proposed customer benefits</u> extraordinary circumstances do not materialize or
4	subsequently are eliminated or changed. Any subsequent modification by the Commission
5	will be within five (5) years of the date of issuance of the order approving the acquisition
6	adjustment. transfer of assets.
