1 P R O C E E D I N G S

2 CHAIRMAN FAY: All right. Commissioners, we
3 will get started with our Special Agenda
4 Conference. This morning we will be taking up
5 20220069 petition for rate increase for Florida
6 City Gas.

7 I am going to recognize Mr. Hampson this
8 morning to provide a summary and update as to the
9 posture we are in for this docket.

10 Mr. Hampson, you are recognized when you are
11 ready to present.

12 MR. HAMPSON: Thank you.

13 Good morning, Commissioners. I am Corey
14 Hampson with the Division of Economics.

15 At the March 28th, 2023, Special Agenda, the
16 Commission approved FCG's revenue requirement as
17 shown in Attachment A to the recommendation. The
18 Commission also voted on issues addressing the
19 forecast of customers and therms, depreciation,
20 rate base, cost of capital, net operating income
21 and cost of service.

22 Today we are here to discuss FCG's rates and
23 tariff, Issues 60, 61, 62, 65, 66 and 73, which
24 were not voted on at the March 28th Special Agenda.

25 Issue 60, customer charges, Issue 61, per

1 therm gas distribution charges, and Issue 62,
2 demand charges, have been calculated based on the
3 Commission approved total revenue requirement for
4 FCG.

5 Staff recommends approval of the customer
6 charges, per therm distribution charges and demand
7 charges as shown in Attachment B to the
8 recommendation.

9 FCG provided customer notifications in
10 August 2022 regarding the proposed rate increase.
11 The notifications included comparisons of current
12 and proposed rates.

13 FCG will also provide a direct notice to
14 customers during May 2023, which will identify the
15 final Commission approved rates and charges.

16 As stated in Issue 65, staff recommends that
17 the proposed rates and charges should become
18 effective on May 1st, 2023.

19 In Issue 66, staff recommends that the
20 Commission should give staff authority to approve
21 the tariffs provided in Attachment B.

22 Lastly, in Issue 73, staff recommends that the
23 final order -- or after the final order is issued,
24 this docket should be closed.

25 This is a post-hearing decision, and

1 participation is limited to Commissioners and
2 staff.

3 Staff is available for questions.

4 Thank you.

5 CHAIRMAN FAY: Great. Thank you, Mr. Hampson.

6 Commissioners, I know we have, as Mr. Hampson
7 pointed out, addressed most of the issues here, so
8 what I was thinking is we could take up the cost of
9 service and rate design issues, as stated by Mr.
10 Hampson. We could -- we would do 60, 61, 62, 65
11 and 66, and then we can take up a motion after that
12 for Issue 73.

13 So with that, Commissioners, presumably we
14 don't have any questions, but let me just make sure
15 if there is any questions or comments on these
16 items.

17 I will take up a motion on 61 -- 60, 61, 62,
18 65 and 66, cost of service and rate design.

19 COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Chairman, I will motion
20 to move staff's recommendations on 60 through 66.

21 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. Got it.

22 COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Second.

23 CHAIRMAN FAY: We have a motion and a second.

24 Show that motion passed unanimously for those
25 items listed in cost of service and rate design.

1 With that, Commissioners, we will move to Item
2 73, closing the docket. I will take up a motion on
3 that item at this time.

4 COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Chairman, move staff's
5 recommendation on 73.

6 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. We have A motion.

7 COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO: Second.

8 CHAIRMAN FAY: Second.

9 Show Issue 73 approved for staff's
10 recommendation.

11 With that, Commissioners, we addressed all
12 issues in this docket, and this Special Agenda is
13 adjourned.
