2	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Awesome, good morning,
3	everyone. By your silence, I will assume that
4	everyone is ready to go and moving forward this
5	morning.
6	Again, good morning. Today is October 17th.
7	It is a little after 9:30 a.m., and we will now
8	call this prehearing conference to order.
9	Mr. Watrous, will you please read the notice?
10	MR. WATROUS: By notice issued on October 6th,
11	2023, this time and place has been set for
12	prehearing conferences in Docket Nos. 20230001,
13	20230002, 20230003, 20230004 and 20230007. The
14	purpose of these prehearings is set out more fully
15	in the notice.
16	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you, Mr. Watrous.
17	Let's move to appearances.
18	MR. WATROUS: There are five dockets to
19	address today. We suggest that all appearances be
20	taken at once. All parties should enter their
21	appearances and declare the dockets they are
22	entering an appearance for. Several parties will
23	make appearances. After the parties make their
24	appearances staff will need to make theirs.
25	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent.

1	Let's go ahead now and take appearances going
2	from left or at least my left to right. We will
3	start with Florida Power & Light.
4	MS. MONCADA: Good morning, Commissioner.
5	Maria Moncada for Florida Power & Light Company for
6	the 01, 02 and 07 dockets. I would also like to
7	enter the following appearances: In the 01 docket,
8	William Cox and David Lee. In the 02 docket,
9	William Cox. And in the 07 docket, Joel Baker.
10	Thank you.
11	MS. CUELLO: Good morning. Stephanie Cuello
12	for Duke Energy. And I would also like to make an
13	appearance on behalf of Matt Bernier and Dianne
14	Triplett, all for the 01, 02 and 07 docket.
15	MR. MEANS: Good morning. Malcolm Means with
16	the Ausley McMullen Law Firm, appearing on behalf
17	of Tampa Electric, along with Jeff Wahlen and
18	Virginia Ponder in dockets 01, 02 and 07.
19	MS. KEATING: Good morning. Beth Keating with
20	the Gunster Law Firm here this morning for FPUC in
21	the 01, 02, 03 and 04 dockets. I will also be
22	appearing for Florida City Gas in the 03 and 04
23	dockets, and for Sebring Gas Systems in the 04
24	docket.
25	MR. SHEF WRIGHT: Good morning, Commissioner.

21	MR. BREW: Good morning, Commissioner. I am

20 COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you.	
MR. WATROUS: And then Austin Watrous on	
behalf of Commission staff in the 03 docket.	I
would also like to enter an appearance for Suz	zanne
Brownless in the 01, Ryan Sandy in the 01, Car	rlos
Marquez the 02, the 04 and the 07, Jacob Imig	in

1	the 02 and the 07, and Tim Sparks in the 04 and the
2	07.
3	MS. CIBULA: And Samantha Cibula, Advisor to
4	the Commission. I would also like to make an
5	appearance for Keith Hetrick, the General Counsel.
6	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you all.
7	Mr. Watrous, are there any preliminary
8	matters?
9	MR. WATROUS: We are unaware of any
10	preliminary matters at this time.
11	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. Let's move
12	on to the dockets. We are going to take the order
13	as 02, 03, 04, 07 and 01, so slightly out of order
14	for organizational purposes.
15	Moving on to 02, Mr. Marquez, are there any
16	preliminary matters that we need to address before
17	we get to the predraft hearing order?
18	MR. MARQUEZ: No, Commissioner La Rosa.
19	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. Thank you.
20	Does any parties have any preliminary matters?
21	Seeing OPC, you are recognized.
22	MR. REHWINKEL: This may be just as good a
23	time as any to state this, Mr. Chairman.
24	The Public Counsel filed, in all five dockets,
25	revised positions on all almost all the issues,

1	and we submitted that electronically to staff. If
2	it's I think it would facilitate matters if we
3	don't go through that each time we get to each
4	docket with each issue.
5	Staff has them and all of our issue
6	positions are designed or intended to facilitated
7	Type 2 stipulations on those issues if one is
8	otherwise to be facility facilitated. So I think
9	it could streamline things just to say our
10	positions have been revised with your staff.
11	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
12	So
13	MR. BREW: Excuse me.
14	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Yep, Mr. Brew, you are
15	recognized.
16	MR. BREW: Just to elaborate on that. In many
17	of the dockets, PCS's position is often agree with
18	OPC. We have reviewed the revised statements by
19	OPC and our positions remain the same.
20	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. Any other
21	comments on that?
22	So when I come to those sections, I will just
23	we will make the assumption that that has been
24	received by us and it's been circulated, and if
25	there is any other thoughts or comments at that

1	point, of course we can bring them up.
2	Okay. So that was a perfect time to state, so
3	that I much appreciate that. It will help us with
4	efficiency moving forward.
5	Let's go through the draft prehearing order.
6	I will identify the sections. I may move a little
7	bit quick, so please feel free to jump in if there
8	are some changes or corrections that ultimately
9	need to be made.
10	So we will start with Section 1, Case
11	Background.
12	Section II, Conduct of Proceedings.
13	Section III, Jurisdiction.
14	Section IV, Procedures in Handling
15	Confidential Information.
16	Section V, Prefiled Testimony, Exhibit and
17	Witnesses.
18	Seeing none. Staff, thoughts?
19	MR. MARQUEZ: Commissioner, with regard to any
20	witness that is not ultimately excused from the
21	hearing, we are recommending that their summary of
22	their testimony be limited to no more than three
23	minutes.
24	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Three minutes it
25	is, seeing no objections to that.

1	Let's move to the order of witnesses, staff.
2	MR. MARQUEZ: If the parties are ultimately
3	willing to excuse any witnesses, we will then
4	confirm with each Commissioner on whether or not
5	they anticipate questions for those witnesses. If
6	the Commission has no questions, we would then
7	inform the parties that those witnesses have been
8	excused and that their testimony be entered into
9	the record, along with exhibits, as though read.
10	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you.
11	Then let's move to basics positions. Do the
12	parties have any changes to their basic positions?
13	Seeing none. Let's move to issues and
14	positions, staff.
15	MR. MARQUEZ: Issues and positions for the 02
16	clause have been included in the draft prehearing
17	order that was circulated to the parties. We note
18	that for any party that has taken a position of no
19	position at this time, if that position is not
20	amended prior to the hearing, it will be changed to
21	no position in the prehearing order.
22	For the order establishing procedure, if a
23	party fails to take a position on any issue, that
24	party also waives their opportunity to conduct
25	cross-examination as it relates to that issue, as

1	well as waives their right to file a post-hearing
2	brief on that issue.
3	MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner La Rosa.
4	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Yes, sir.
5	MR. REHWINKEL: Just for the record for this
6	docket, and all the others, I don't think our
7	language that facilitates a Type 2 stipulation is
8	always accompanied by a footnote that describes
9	what a Type 2 stipulation is, and I didn't see it
10	in here, but we for purposes of doing this for
11	all the dockets, we would ask that that footnote be
12	included in each of the five prehearing orders.
13	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. All right. So
14	noted.
15	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you.
16	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Any other
17	thoughts?
18	MR. MOYLE: I assume for all the parties, that
19	that footnote would not be specific to OPC but just
20	be kind of a general footnote to say Type 2
21	stipulations are blah, blah, blah, but they don't
22	represent a position of a party.
23	We have a similar concern but don't want to
24	burden the record beyond saying we would like for
25	that language to apply to FIPUG as well.

1	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Is that fair
2	amongst the parties?
3	MR. SHEF WRIGHT: Yes, sir.
4	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
5	Then let's move on to the exhibit list, staff.
6	MR. MARQUEZ: All right. We have prepared a
7	comprehensive exhibit list for this docket that
8	includes the prefiled exhibits, as well as any
9	exhibits staff wishes to ultimately be included in
10	the record. We will check with the parties before
11	the hearing to see whether or not there are any
12	objections. We have already heard back from FPL,
13	TECO and FPUC.
14	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. Let's move
15	then to the proposed stipulations.
16	MR. MARQUEZ: At this time, we are unaware of
17	any stipulations.
18	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Pending motions?
19	MR. MARQUEZ: No.
20	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Pending confidentiality
21	motions?
22	MR. MARQUEZ: None.
23	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Post-hearing
24	procedures?
25	MR. MARQUEZ: If parties agree to waive

1	briefs, the Commission could make a bench decision
2	for this docket. If there are any issues that do
3	need to be briefed, we recommend that post-hearing
4	briefs be no longer than 40 pages maximum.
5	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: 40 pages it is, if they
6	are filed. That seems fair. All parties in
7	agreement with that?
8	Okay. Let's go, then, to rules.
9	MR. MARQUEZ: All right. Staff recommends
10	that, Commissioner, you make a ruling today that
11	opening statements not exceed three minutes per
12	party.
13	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Three minutes it
14	is. Fair, seeing no objections.
15	Let's move on, then, to other matters.
16	MR. MARQUEZ: There are no other matters that
17	we are aware of that need to be addressed today.
18	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent.
19	So then let's move on out of the 02 and
20	into the 03 docket.
21	(Proceedings concluded.)
