We are writing to OPPOSE the application of Environmental Utilities, LLC to install central sewer on our island.

We are not opposed to sewer but we are opposed to Environmental Utilities providing it. If we get sewer, it should be provided by Charlotte County, not a private for profit company. This company has no (zero) experience in central sewer. They are very opaque with the rates but from what we have gleaned, they will be much higher than the rates that would be charged by the county. We do not believe that they know what they are doing and are terrified of potential spills that would spoil our pristine islands. They have conducted NO

tests of the surrounding waters that indicate that there is any problem with the current septic systems. They have demonstrated NO need except the need to make money. Please do not allow inexperienced operators to muddle this in one of the most pristine areas in our state.
