As a concerned Duke Energy customer [and AARP member in Florida], I am writing to express my opposition to Duke Energy's proposed rate increase.

My summer electric bills for a 1700 square foot house reached \$900/month in 2023 and neither Duke Energy nor the State of FL offer any programs to help unless I am living at the poverty level.

It's one of the reasons I am planning to leave the state of Florida.

I urge you to carefully consider the impact of a rate increase on Florida residents, particularly

the most vulnerable among us. With the rising costs of living, including healthcare and housing, a hike in utility rates has already decreased my quality of life.

I ask that you prioritize the interests of consumers over corporate greed and reject Duke Energy's proposed increase to the return on equity and fixed customer charge. This is pure profit that customers should not have to pay for. Now more than ever, it is crucial to ensure that essential services remain affordable and accessible to all Floridians.
