On June 4, 2024, Duke Energy Florida, LLC (DEF or Company) filed a request for confidential treatment of Document No. 03333-2024. This document contains confidential information from DEF's responses to the Office of Public Counsel's Ninth Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 222-224) and Ninth Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 87-93). The confidential information contained within the response can be described as detailed information about the location and nature of DEF's transmission system as well as DEF's expenditures on its transmission projects.

In its request for confidentiality, DEF asserts that disclosure of this information would harm DEF, as the information relates to competitive interests and security measures. Furthermore, DEF states that the Company treats the highlighted information provided in Exhibits A and C as private and has not publicly disclosed it. If disclosed, it could compromise the security interests of the Company and also impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.

Staff has reviewed the documents and concurs with DEF that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Section 366.093(3)(c) and (e), Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would compromise the security interests of DEF, and impair its competitive business interests. Therefore, staff recommends the request by DEF for confidential classification of Document No. 03333-2024 be approved.
