PETITION TO INTERVENE OF NUCOR STEEL FLORIDA, INC.

- 4. <u>Statement of Affected Interests.</u> Nucor owns and operates a steel production facility located within Duke Energy Florida's ("DEF") electric service territory. Nucor purchases large amounts of electric energy from DEF to power its steel making operations.
- 5. On December 27, 2024, DEF filed a Petition to conduct a limited proceeding to authorize commencement of recovery of incremental storm restoration costs and interest related to Hurricanes Debby, Helene, and Milton, and replenishment of DEF's authorized storm reserve ("Petition"). DEF seeks to recover approximately \$1,089.6 million beginning March 2025, subject to final true-up. The proposed surcharge recovery factors will have a significant impact on DEF's customers, including Nucor. Given that charges proposed in the Petition will affect the rates charged and paid by DEF customers, and because Nucor purchases substantial amounts of electric energy from DEF, the outcome of this proceeding may adversely affect Nucor's interests.
- 6. <u>Disputed Issues of Material Fact.</u> Nucor is not aware of any disputed issues of material fact at this early stage of the proceeding. However, Nucor anticipates that disputed issues of material fact may be identified over the course of the proceeding, and Nucor reserves the right to identify such issues.
- 7. <u>Disputed Legal Issues.</u> Nucor is not aware of any disputed legal issues at this early stage of the proceeding. However, Nucor anticipates that disputed legal issues

may be identified over the course of the proceeding, and Nucor reserves the right to identify such issues.

- 8. <u>Statement of Ultimate Facts Alleged.</u> Alleged ultimate facts include, but are not limited to, whether the proposed rate and relief request by DEF are just and reasonable. Nucor anticipates additional alleged ultimate facts may be identified over the course of the proceeding.
- 9. <u>Laws Entitling Petitioner to Relief and Relation to Alleged Facts.</u> The rules and statutes entitling Nucor to relief include but are not necessarily limited to the following:

 Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, Sections 366.04 through 366.07,

 Florida Statutes, and Rule 28-106.205, Florida Administrative Code.
- 10. <u>Statement of Conferral.</u> In accordance with Rule 28-106.204(3), Florida

 Administrative Code, Nucor has conferred with all parties to this proceeding regarding

 Nucor's intervention. DEF takes no position on Nucor's intervention; the Office of Public

 Counsel does not object to Nucor's intervention. As such, no party indicated an

 objection to Nucor's intervention.
- 11. <u>Relief.</u> Nucor requests that it be permitted to intervene as a full party in this docket.

WHEREFORE, Nucor respectfully requests that the Commission enter an order allowing it to intervene as a full party in this docket.
