**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL
CLASSIFICATION OF INFORMATION PROVIDED IN ITS RESPONSE TO
FLORIDIANS AGAINST INCREASED RATES, INC.'S FIRST REQUEST
FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS (No. 2)**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby requests confidential classification of certain documents and information provided in its response to the Floridians Against Increased Rates, Inc.'s ("FAIR") First Request for Production of Documents (No. 2) ("Confidential Information"). In support of its request, FPL states as follows:

1. FPL served its response to FAIR's First Request for Production of Documents (No. 2) on July 23, 2025. Consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, this request is being filed contemporaneously with the service of those responses to request confidential classification of certain information contained therein.

2. The following exhibits are attached to and made a part of this Request:

- a. Exhibit A consists of a copy of the confidential documents on which all information that FPL asserts is confidential has been highlighted.
- b. Exhibit B is a redacted version of the confidential documents. For the documents in Exhibit A that are confidential in their entirety, Exhibit B consists of an insert page.
- c. Exhibit C is a table that identifies the information for which confidential treatment is being sought, references the specific statutory basis for the

claim of confidentiality, and identifies the declarants who supports the requested classification.

- d. Exhibit D consists of the declarations of Scott Bores in support of this Request.

3. FPL submits that the Confidential Information is intended to be and has been treated and maintained by FPL as confidential business information, and its disclosure would cause harm to FPL and its customers. Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

4. As described more fully in the declaration included in Exhibit D, the Confidential Information contains proprietary confidential business information, which contains information relating to competitive business interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the providers of the information. Specifically, the information contains reports provided to FPL from ratings agencies that are proprietary to those agencies. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes.

5. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information is proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* Section 366.093(4), Florida Statutes.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.


DECLARATION OF SCOTT BORES
