I bought an EV in 2023 after looking at the cost to charge the battery here in Florida. I was pleased to see that FPL has different rates, depending on when I would charge my EV. The "off-peak" rate is only 9 cents per KWH. I have religiously charged my even between 10 PM and 6 AM. However I am still being charged 12 cents per KWH. FPL says that they are unable to apply the off-peak rate because they can't tell that I'm charging during off-peak hours. I KNOW is is untrue because I not only have a "smart" meter but my monthly bill breaks down how much power I am using every hour of the day. FPL likes to brag about how much they support "clean" energy use and how they support EVs. However, they certainly don't do anything to "encourage" us to charge our cars during off-peak hours. I can say more about this and their "Evolution" program but I will save it for later. The bottom line is that its wrong for them to increase our rates rather than encourage us to use power more efficiently. Please contact me if you want further information on this issue.
