JOINT REQUEST OF PENINSULA PIPELINE COMPANY AND FLORIDA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMPANY FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION FOR INFORMATION

Peninsula Pipeline Company ("Peninsula" or "Company") and Florida Public Utilities Company ("FPUC")(jointly herein, "Companies") by and through their undersigned counsel, pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and consistent with Rule 25-22.006(3), Florida Administrative Code, hereby submit this Joint Request for Confidential Classification for information contained in Second Revised Exhibit A to the Second Amendment to Transportation Service Agreement between FPUC and PPC ("Second Amendment"). The information for which the Companies seek confidential treatment is information that is similar to that which the Commission has afforded confidential classification in prior cases, namely Order No. PSC-2018-0146-CFO-GU, issued March 19, 2018 in Docket No. 20180015-GU. In support thereof, the Companies hereby state:

1. The Companies seek confidential classification of the highlighted information in Second Revised Exhibit A to the Second Amendment to Transportation Service Agreement between FPUC and PPC, in the following locations:

The above-referenced information is directly related to the negotiated rates and terms of the Second Amendment, which Peninsula and FPUC treat as proprietary confidential business information consistent with the definition of that term in Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.

- 2. The information for which the Companies seek confidential classification is information that the Company and FPUC both treat as confidential, and that meets the definition of "proprietary confidential business information" as set forth in Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes, which provides:
 - (3) Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to:
 - (a) Trade secrets.
 - (b) Internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors.
 - (c) Security measures, systems, or procedures.
 - (d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.
 - (e) Information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.

- (f) Employee personnel information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities.
- 3. Release of the referenced information as a public record would reveal the specific rates and contracted amounts included in competitive contracts, as well anticipated costs. Disclosure of this information could impair Peninsula's and/or FPUC's ability to compete for goods and services and provide their respective competitors with an unfair competitive advantage. As such, the Companies request that the Commission protect this information consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code. To the extent of both Companies' knowledge, this information is not otherwise available in the public domain. Thus, the information meets the definition of "proprietary confidential business information" as set forth in Sections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes. As such, the Companies request that the Commission protect this information consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.
- 4. Included with this Request are highlighted copies of Second Revised Exhibit A to the Second Amendment to Transportation Service Agreement between PPC and FPUC. In addition, two redacted copies of the documents are enclosed.
- 5. The Companies ask that confidential classification be granted for a period of at least 18 months. Should the Commission no longer find that it needs to retain the information, the Companies respectfully request that the confidential information be returned to Peninsula.

WHEREFORE, Peninsula Pipeline Company and Florida Public Utilities Company respectfully request that the highlighted information contained in Second Revised Exhibit A to Second Amendment to Transportation Service Agreement between Peninsula Pipeline Company, Inc. and Florida Public Utilities Company be classified as "proprietary confidential business
