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Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Energy for Innovation Association (“FEIA”) requests confidential classification of certain information sent in response to Florida Power & Light Company’s (“FPL”) 1<sup>st</sup> set of interrogatories (“ROG”). More specifically, the information which confidentiality is sought relates to ROG Nos. 1 & 7.

According to FEIA, the confidential information is intended to be and has been treated and maintained by FEIA and its consultants as confidential business information. The disclosure of the confidential information would cause harm to FEIA, its members, and its consultants. Specifically, the information pertains to consultant compensation pay and customer account numbers.

Staff has reviewed FEIA’s confidentiality request and agrees that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Section 366.093(3)(d), F.S. Therefore, staff recommends that the request for confidentiality of certain information included in Document No. 04672-2025 be approved.
