On February 27, 2026, pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), Duke Energy Florida (DEF or Company) filed its second request for extension of confidential classification for certain information contained within DEF's 2020 Fourth Quarter Owner's Report and Revised Exhibit D, Affidavit of Gene Flavors, Jr., as appears in Document No. 02355-2021.

On February 22, 2021, DEF filed the original Request for Confidential Classification related to this document. DEF's Request was granted by Order No. PSC-2022-0239-CFO-EI on June 27, 2022. DEF's first request for extension of confidential classification was granted via subsequent Commission Order.

The Company is claiming confidentiality for certain information contained within each of the above referenced documents under Section 366.093(3), F.S. Per the Statute, propriety of confidential business information includes, but is not limited to: Subsections (d) "[i]nformation concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms," and (e) "[i]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information."

Staff has reviewed the information contained in the aforementioned Owner's report and Exhibit D, as well as the Company's confidentiality request. In staff's opinion, the information that is the subject of the confidentiality request continues to meet the criteria for confidentiality contained in Section 366.093(3)(d) and (e), F.S. Therefore, staff recommends that the current request for extension of confidentiality of certain information included in Document No. 02355-2021 be approved.
