2. Number of meters served in calendar year 2025

For Calendar Year 2025 in the month of December, the City served 902 residential and 130 commercial customers for a total of 1032 customers

3. Facility Inspections

- a) **The City of Moore Haven continuously inspects distribution lines, poles, and structures. As discrepancies are located, the electric crew consisting of two linemen plan and perform repairs. There is a visual inspection of all poles every year. Crews also perform physical inspections of poles using the sound method. The City inspects and upgrades the system where and when needed. During inspections pole patches are applied to the top above the crossarms where needed and replaced the poles as needed. Crew also straightened and restabilized leaning poles as necessary.**
- b) **Since the City is just over one square mile, inspections are done during routine operations for 100% coverage.**
- c) **During 2025, replacement of distribution poles included four (4) 35 ft poles and six (6) 40 ft poles were replaced due to age and/or damages from past events.**
- d) **This City is upgrading to 3-phase poles and has no transmission lines or poles.**

4. Vegetation Management

- a) **The City continuously trims trees located in easements and on rights-of-way throughout the year with 100% of coverage of the power distribution system throughout the year. The City monitors all new construction on private property and communicates with owners the importance of locating vegetation away from all utilities.**

Code Enforcement makes continuous rounds throughout the City and will identify and report ongoing issues.

- b) D The City continued to expend approximately 20% of the Electric Department's resources for vegetation management in 2025.**
