ORDER GRANTING REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

On June 12, 1989, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) filed a Request for Extension of Time in Which to Respond to the Joint Motion of Public Counsel and FIPUG to Designate Issue. FPL requested a one-week extension of time to respond to the Joint Motion, citing "the press of business, and the complexity of the subject matter." According to FPL, counsel for the Office of Public Counsel and the Florida Industrial Power Users Group (FIPUG) have no objection to the extension.

Rule 22-22.037(2)(b), Florida Administrative Code, specifies that written memoranda in opposition to motions may be filed within seven days after service of a written motion. Because this rule is procedural, rather than substantive, it can be waived. Extending the time period for response will not affect other events scheduled in this this docket, nor will it inconvenience other parties.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED that Florida Power & Light Company's Motion is hereby granted. It is further

ORDERED that Florida Power & Light Company shall file its response, if any, on or before June 21, 1989.
