ORDER GRANTING THE COALITION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS LEAVE TO INTERVENE

BY THE COMMISSION:

On June 26, 1989, Florida Power Corporation (FPC) filed its proposed tariff revision. FPC proposed changes in the company's OL-1 and SL-1 lighting rate schedule regarding requirements for contract for service. Optional use of an application form was made mandatory for OL-1 service, reflecting the company's actual practice. Additionally, an application form was designed for SL-1 to replace the Company's standard contract form. The new form, FPC informs, will accommodate billing changes due to additional installation without the need for contract amendments.

On July 24, 1989, the Coalition of Local Governments (CLG) petitioned for Leave to Intervene pursuant to Rule 25-22.39, Florida Administrative Code. CLG is an association of local governmental entities which are retail customers of FPC served pursuant to a variety of its rate schedules. CLG contends that the rates, terms and conditions for retail electric service provided by FPC to the local governments may be affected by this proceeding and that CLG should be granted leave to intervene to protect its interest.

In consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED that the Coalition of Local Governments is granted leave to intervene in the proceeding. It is further

ORDERED that all parties to this proceeding shall furnish copies of all testimony, exhibits, pleadings and other
