NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTIONORDER APPROVING SURVEY INSTRUMENT

BY THE COMMISSION:

Notice is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for formal proceeding pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Rule 25-17.006(4), Florida Administrative Code, requires electric utilities to collect information on the appliance stock, housing characteristics, household demographic characteristics, and billing history for a representative sample of residential electric customers, every four years. The rule specifies that the Commission prescribe the survey instrument used to gather information from each household in that Commission staff uses the results to provide information on electric usage patterns of residential customers and to aid analyses of utility conservation programs.

On July 12, 1989, staff conducted a workshop to discuss staff's draft survey instrument by interested parties. Staff Draft #2, resulting from comments to the initial draft by interested parties, was sent to all participating parties for final comment.


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We find that the Survey Instrument included in staff's recommendation as Attachment A should be approved for use in implementing Rule 25-17.006 requiring a survey of residential electric customers' homes in 1990. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that this docket shall become final and this docket closed unless a petition or formal proceeding is received by the close of business day on November 15, 1989.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

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The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature and will not become effective or final, except as provided by Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.029(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a) and (f), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on November 15, 1989.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code, and as reflected in a subsequent order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
