ORDER GRANTING CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

On July 30, 1991, Florida Power & Light Company filed a request for confidential classification of certain internal audit documents. These documents were furnished to Commission staff during their review of the company's Internal Audit Department.

Section 366.093(1), Florida Statutes, provides that records which are found by the Commission to contain proprietary confidential business information shall be exempt from the public disclosure required by section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. Section 366.093(3)(b), Florida Statutes, defines proprietary confidential business information to include "internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors." Because I find that the documents for which Florida Power & Light Company requests confidential classification, identical documents identified by the Commission as Document Nos. 7334-91 and 7654-91, are internal auditing controls and the reports of internal auditors, they will be classified as confidential.

In consideration of the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by Commissioner J. Terry Deason, as Prehearing Officer, that the request for confidential classification filed by Florida Power & Light Company, on July 31, 1991, is granted pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, and Section 366.093, Florida Statutes.

ORDERED that Document Nos. 7334-91 and 7654-91 shall be confidential for a period of 18 months from the date of this order, and shall be returned to the company at the conclusion of that period.



NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: 1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.038(2), Florida Administrative Code, if issued by a Prehearing Officer; 2) reconsideration within 15 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code, if issued by the Commission; or 3) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or sewer utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
