ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

BY THE COMMISSION:

On October 26, 1995, ALLTEL Florida, Inc. filed a tariff to introduce Station Message Detail Recording (SMDR) as a Centrex optional service.

SMDR is a service that provides and records the details of each station line's usage. This data is stored in a buffer device in the central office. The customer can access the data by using either a dial-up line or by a dedicated facility. For dial-up, the data is downloaded during a polling session. For either dial-up polling or dedicated/real time downloads, the customer can access this data at either 2400 or 9600 baud. The usage detail recordings include the following:

- the Centrex line number or incoming tie line group which originated the call.
- the called number, date, time and call duration.
- the type of facility used for routing the call, i.e., WATS, Common Control Switching Arrangement, normal exchange trunk, Foreign Exchange, etc.
- charges for toll calls completed over the normal exchange trunks.

In its demand forecast ALLTEL has projected a growth factor in access lines, per line size category, of about 2-3% annually. To launch SMDR the Company has projected a one time initial investment of \$163,947 will be incurred. This will provide for dial-up and

polling capabilities. The investment will cover necessary hardware, software, engineering expense, installation and labor costs. SMDR is projected to provide cumulative contributions of approximately \$128,973 by the end of year 5. The proposed rates for SMDR are listed in the table below:

| Centrex Line Groups | Proposed Rates per Line |
|---------------------|-------------------------|
| 1 - 50 Lines        | \$0.95                  |
| 51 - 100 Lines      | 0.90                    |
| 101 - 150 Lines     | 0.80                    |
| 151 + Lines         | 0.50                    |

Upon consideration, we find that ALLTEL's tariff to add Station Message Detail Recording as a Centrex optional service is appropriate. This service will provide and record the details of each station line's usage and allow communications managers to efficiently forecast and allocate their resources. Further, the proposed rates cover the incremental cost associated with providing SMDR.

Therefore, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that ALLTEL Florida, Inc.'s tariff to add Station Message Detail Recording (SMDR) as a Centrex optional service is hereby approved. It is further


ORDERED that this tariff shall be effective December 26, 1995. It is further

ORDERED that if a protest is filed in accordance with the requirements set forth below, the tariff shall remain in effect with any increase in revenues held subject to refund pending resolution of the protest. It is further

ORDERED that if no protest is filed, this docket shall be closed.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The Commission's decision on this tariff is interim in nature and will become final, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed files a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.036(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on February 6, 1996.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final on the day subsequent to the above date.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this Order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this Order becomes final on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the date this Order becomes final, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
