NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION  
ORDER DENYING REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM  
REQUIREMENT THAT EACH TELEPHONE STATION  
SHALL ALLOW INCOMING CALLS

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

On September 30, 1996 (Docket No. 961195-TL), and November 5, 1996 (Docket No. 961323-TL), United Telephone Company of Florida (United) submitted two separate petitions containing four requests for exemption of Rule 25-24(515)(8), Florida Administrative Code, to block incoming calls from certain pay telephone stations.

United's forms had not been properly signed by the Sheriff or the Chief of Police of the listed jurisdictions, as required by rule. Our staff brought this to United's attention and also mailed United the forms requesting the proper signatures. Our staff then contacted United several times, by telephone and by mail, in the months following to ensure that the properly signed forms would be submitted.

On February 10, 1997, our staff faxed the company a written request for submission of the forms with the proper signatures. Thereafter, United assured staff that the forms would be properly signed and returned to the Commission. United had not submitted the properly signed forms by the date of this decision, June 24, 1997. When we receive the new forms, we will consider those request. The particular exemption requests before us, however, are hereby denied.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that United Telephone Company of Florida's requests for exemption of Rule 25-24(515)(8), Florida Administrative Code, to block incoming calls are hereby denied. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, these Dockets shall be closed.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature and will not become effective or final, except as provided by Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code. Any person whose substantial

interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.029(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a) and (f), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on August 5, 1997.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party substantially affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
