NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER GRANTING CERTIFICATE TO PROVIDE ALTERNATIVE LOCAL EXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed in this Order is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a termal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Knology of Panama City, Inc. d/b/a Knology (Knology) has applied for a certificate to provide alternative local exchange telecommunications service, pursuant to Section to 131, Florida Statutes. Upon review of its application, it appears that Knology has sufficient technical, financial, and managerial capability to provide such service. Accordingly, we hereby grant to Knology Certificate No. 5345 which shall authorize it to provide alternative local exchange telecommunications services throughout the State of Florida, except for the territories of earnings-regulated small local exchange companies, as set forth in Section 364.337(1), Florida Statutes.

If this Order becomes final and effective, it shall serve as Knology's certificate. It should, therefore, be retained by Knology as proof of certification.

Alternative local exchange telecommunications providers (ALECs) are subject to Chapter 25-24, Florida Administrative Code, Part XV, Rules Governing Telecommunitations Service Provided by Alternative Local Exchange Companies. ALESS are also required to comply with all applicable provisions of Chapter 364, Florida Statutes, and Chapters 25-4, Florida Administrative Code.

In addition, Section 364.33/(2), Florits Statutes, requires ALECs which provide basic local telecommunications service to provide access to 911 services. This Communication has no rules specifying the 911 services that either an incumbent local exchange company (ILEC) or an ALEC must provide; however, 911 service that is inferior to that provided by the ILEC would clearly not be in the public interest. Accordingly, we find that Section 364.337(2), Florida Statutes, requires ALECs which provide basic local telecommunications services to provide at least the same level of 911 services as that provided by the ILEC serving the same area.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that we hereby grant to Knology of Panama City, Inc. d/b/a Knology Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Service Certificate No. 5345 subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that this Order shall berve as Knelogy of Panama City, Inc. d/b/a Knology's certificate and show a be retained by Knology of Panama City, Inc. d/b/a Knology as proof of certification. It is further

ORDERED that each alternative local exchange company which provides basic local telecommunications services shall provide at least the same level of 911 services as that provided by the incumbent local exchange company serving the same area. It is further
