ORDER APPROVING NAME CHANGE AND CLOSING DOCKET

BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 26, 1998, Hudson Utilities, Inc. d/b/a Hudson Bay Company (Hudson or utility) filed an application requesting approval to change its name to Hudson Utilities, Inc., pursuant to Rule 25-30.039, Florida Administrative Code. Hudson holds Certificate No. 104-S and has been operating under our jurisdiction since 1973. Hudson is a Class B utility, which currently serves approximately 1259 residential and 80 commercial customers.

According to Hudson's application, there is no change in ownership or control of the utility or its assets as a result of the name change. The reason given for deleting the "d/b/a Hudson Bay Company" from the name was that it is not being used. The change has been registered with the Division of Corporations, Department of State. The effective date of the name change is January 1, 1998. A copy of the proposed notice to the customers reflecting the new name has been provided.

We, therefore, find that Hudson's request to change its name to Hudson Utilities, Inc. is in compliance with the provisions of Rules 25-30.032 and 25-30.039, Florida Administrative Code, and it is approved. The utility's proposed notice is also approved; the utility shall send the notice to all of its customers upon issuance of this Order. Hudson has filed a tariff reflecting the new name. The tariff shall be effective for service rendered or connections made on or after the stamped approval date on the tariff sheets. Hudson also returned Certificate No. 103-S to the Commission for entry reflecting the change in the name of the utility.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
