BY THE COMMISSION:

By letter dated March 9, 1998, Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a Gold Coast CableVision, holder of Shared Tenant Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 5247, requested that Certificate No. 5247 be amended to reflect the new corporate name, Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a CableVision Communications. Upon review of the Department of State, Division of Corporations' records, it appears that Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a Gold Coast CableVision has properly registered the new corporate name. Accordingly, we find it appropriate to amend Certificate No. 5247 to reflect the Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a CableVision Communications.

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the request by Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a Gold Coast CableVision to change the name on Certificate No. 5247 from Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a Gold Coast CableVision to Rifkin/Narragansett South Florida CATV Limited Partnership d/b/a CableVision Communications is hereby approved. 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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida

Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
