NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION
ORDER APPROVING CORPORATE REORGANIZATION

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, provides that a person may not acquire ownership or control of any telecommunications facility, or any extension thereof for the purpose of providing telecommunications services to the public, including the acquisition, transfer, or assignment of majority organizational

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control or controlling stock ownership, without prior approval from this Commission.

By letter dated June 9, 2001, BroadStreet Communications, Inc. (BroadStreet) filed with this Commission an application for approval of corporate reorganization of BroadStreet and its parent BroadStreet Communications, LLC. BroadStreet is the holder of Alternative Local Exchange (ALEC) Certificate No. 7452. BroadStreet filed notice with the Commission that it has recently completed a reorganization through its parent BroadStreet Communications, LLC, whereby a new non-jurisdictional holding company entity, BroadStreet Communications Holdings, Inc., has been formed as a wholly-owned subsidiary of BroadStreet Communications, LLC and as the direct parent of BroadStreet. BroadStreet has stated that the transaction will be virtually transparent to its customers in Florida and it will not affect the services being provided. BroadStreet has stated that it will continue to operate under its existing certificated name and tariff on file with this Commission. The establishment of the intermediary does not involve any change in management, operations, officers or directors of BroadStreet Communications, LLC or BroadStreet Communications, Inc.

In accordance with our authority under Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, to approve the acquisition or transfer of majority organizational control or controlling stock ownership of a telecommunications company providing service in Florida, we have reviewed the Petition of BroadStreet and find it appropriate to approve it. We have based our review and decision upon an analysis of the public's interest in efficient, reliable telecommunications service.

Based on the foregoing, it is,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that BroadStreet Communications, Inc.'s request for approval of corporate reorganization through its parent BroadStreet Communications, LLC is hereby approved. It is further


ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is

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received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this docket shall be closed.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing that is available under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing will be granted or result in the relief sought.

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Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on August 31, 2001.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
