BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

CoreComm Florida, Inc. (CoreComm), holder of Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate (IXC) of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 7590 and Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Certificate (ALEC) of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 7386 and OCOM Corporation d/b/a Cellular Long Distance (Cellular Long Distance) holder of Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity

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No. 4047 have requested the cancellation of IXC Certificate Nos. 7590 and 4047 and ALEC Certificate No. 7386. CoreComm and Cellular Long Distance have complied with the provisions of Rule(s) 25-24.474(2) and 25-24.820(2), Florida Administrative Code, by providing adequate notice in writing of their request for cancellation of their IXC and ALEC certificates and by submitting their Regulatory Assessment Fees (RAFs) for the year 2002. Accordingly, we find it appropriate to cancel IXC Certificate Nos. 7590 and 4047 and ALEC Certificate No. 7386, effective April 15, 2002. We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 364.335, Florida Statutes.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that CoreComm Florida, Inc.'s Certificate No. 7590 to provide Interexchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective April 15, 2002. It is further

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that CoreComm Florida, Inc.'s Certificate No. 7386 to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective April 15, 2002. It is further

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that OCOM Corporation d/b/a Cellular Long Distance's Certificate No. 4047 to provide Interexchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective April 15, 2002. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this docket shall be closed.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing that is available under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on July 4, 2002.

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In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this/these docket(s) before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
