ORDER ESTABLISHING 2005 DOCKET NUMBER

BY THE COMMISSION:

In order to avoid confusion and reduce administrative handling problems in this active and continuing docket, we are establishing a new docket for the calendar year 2005. Beginning January 3, 2005, Docket No. 040064-OT, APPLICATIONS FOR QUALIFIED REPRESENTATIVE STATUS, will be identified as Docket No. 050008-OT. The establishment of a new docket number is for administrative convenience only.

The new docket number will be used by all who wish to apply for qualified representative status on the effective date of January 3, 2005, and thereafter. The establishment of this new Docket does not negate any prior approval of qualified representative status that extended through January 31, 2005. Any new applications for qualified representative status for the calendar year 2005 shall be filed in Docket No. 050008-OT. This Docket shall, henceforth, be rolled over from year to year in this manner administratively.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that beginning January 3, 2005, all matters previously the subject of Docket No. 040064-OT, shall be part of Docket No. 050008-OT. It is further

ORDERED that this Docket shall, henceforth, be rolled over from year to year administratively in the manner set forth in the body of this Order.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
