ORDER GRANTING AT&T COMMUNICATIONS OF THE SOUTHERN STATES, LLC'S  
PETITION TO INTERVENE

By Petition filed on December 17, 2004, AT&T Communications of the Southern States, LLC ("AT&T") has requested permission to intervene in these proceedings. AT&T is a telecommunications company that has been duly certificated by this Commission as a competitive local exchange telecommunications company and an interexchange company in Florida. In the instant docket, this Commission will address whether to expand eligibility criteria for Lifeline and Link-Up assistance. The outcome of such determinations could affect AT&T's substantial interests. Therefore, this Commission's actions in this docket may have a direct and immediate effect on AT&T's substantial interests.

Having reviewed the Petition, it appears that AT&T's substantial interests may be affected by these proceedings, because it provides local exchange telecommunications and intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Florida. Therefore, the Petition shall be granted. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code, AT&T takes the case as it finds it.

Therefore, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the Petition to Intervene filed by AT&T Communications of the Southern States, LLC is hereby granted. It is further

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
