FOURTH ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURE SETTING  
NEW CONTROLLING DATES

By Order No. PSC-03-0192-PCO-WS, issued February 7, 2003, a procedural schedule was established setting forth the controlling dates for this docket. New controlling dates were established by Order No. PSC-03-0233-PCO-WS, issued February 19, 2003, and Order No. PSC-03-0841-PCO-WS, issued July 21, 2003. On March 4, 2004, a Motion for Continuance was filed by Mad Hatter Utility, Inc. (Mad Hatter or utility), which was granted by Order No. PSC-04-0299-PCO-WS, issued March 17, 2004. On July 1, 2004, Mad Hatter filed a Second Motion for Continuance, which was granted by Order No. PSC-04-0698-PCO-WS, issued July 19, 2004. On February 28, 2005, Mad Hatter filed a Third Motion for Continuance, which was granted by Order No. PSC-05-0256-PCO-WS, issued March 7, 2005. This matter was set for an administrative hearing on February 22-23, 2006. Due to scheduling conflicts, the administrative hearing was subsequently rescheduled for February 28-March 1, 2006.

Due to the rescheduling of the administrative hearing, this Order sets forth revised controlling dates. The following revised dates shall now govern this case.

1)	Discovery Cutoff	February 21, 2006
2)	Hearing	February 28-March 1, 2006
3)	Briefs	March 29, 2006

Based on the foregoing, it is



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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
