ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION

By petition dated April 5, 2005, the Federal Executive Agencies (FEA) requested permission to intervene in this proceeding. FEA states that it consists of certain agencies of the United States Government which have offices, facilities, and/or installations in the service area of Florida Power & Light Company (FPL). FEA alleges that relief requested in FPL's petition will potentially increase its costs of electricity. Therefore, FEA concludes it will be substantially affected by any action the Commission takes in this docket. On April 11, 2005, FPL filed a response to FEA's petition to intervene stating that it had no objection to FEA's participation in this docket.

Having reviewed the Petition, it appears that FEA's substantial interests may be affected by this proceeding. FPL did not express opposition to FEA's request to intervene, and the time for doing so has elapsed. Therefore, the Petition shall be granted. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code, FEA takes the case as it finds it.

Therefore, it is


ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the Petition to Intervene filed by the Federal Executive Agencies is hereby granted. It is further

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
