ORDER AUTHORIZING QUALIFIED REPRESENTATIVE STATUS

On May 6, 2005, the South Florida Hospital and Healthcare Association (SFHHA) filed a written request pursuant to Rule 28-106.106, Florida Administrative Code, for Mark F. Sundback and Kenneth L. Wiseman of the law firm Andrews Kurth LLP, located at 1701 Pennsylvania, NW, Suite 300, Washington D.C. 20006, to appear as Qualified Representatives for SFHHA in Docket No. 050045-EI. Mr. George E. Humphrey, who is admitted and in good standing with Bar in the State of Florida, attests that the two attorneys are in good standing of the Bar of The District of Columbia and admitted to practice before various U.S. Courts of Appeals including the District of Columbia Court of Appeals. In addition, Mr. Humphrey represents that each attorney is experienced in the matters involved in public utility regulation, and has practiced extensively before agencies engaged in regulation. Further, both Mr. Sundback and Mr. Wiseman also certify in a written statement that each has read the applicable provisions of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration and the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar.

After reviewing the request, it appears that both attorneys have the necessary qualifications to responsibly represent SFHHA's interests in a manner that will not impair the fairness of the proceeding, or the correctness of the action to be taken. Having met the requirements of Rule 28-106.106(4), Florida Administrative Code, Mark. F. Sundback and Kenneth L. Wiseman are authorized to appear as Qualified Representatives on behalf of SFHHA in this docket.

Based on the foregoing, it is



NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
