ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR ONE DAY EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE TESTIMONY


On December 3, 2007, Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. (AUF) filed a motion for a one-day extension of time to file its direct testimony in this docket. By Order No. PSC-07-0777-PCO-WS, issued September 25, 2007, intervenor testimony was due to be filed on December 3, 2007. AUF states that it will sponsor the prefiled direct testimony of John F. Guastella in this proceeding, and that Mr. Guastella has been required to devote substantial time to an illness in his family and was also required to appear recently in a hearing in New Jersey. Mr. Guastella requires one additional day for the completion of his testimony, up to and until December 4, 2007. AUF represents that the Office of Public Counsel and Utilities, Inc. do not object to the motion.

Upon consideration, the Unopposed Motion for One Day Extension of Time is granted. AUF shall file its direct testimony by the close of business on December 4, 2007.

Based upon the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by Commissioner Matthew M. Carter II, as Prehearing Officer, that Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc.'s Unopposed Motion for One Day Extension of Time to File Testimony is granted.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Office of Commission Clerk, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
