ORDER GRANTING BRIGHT HOUSE'S
MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

On January 15, 2009, pursuant to Rule 28-106.303(3), Florida Administrative Code, Bright House Networks Information Services (Florida) LLC and Bright House Networks, LLC (collectively, "Bright House") filed a Motion for Extension of Time ("Motion") to respond to Verizon's Motion to Dismiss and Alternative Motion for Summary Final Order ("Motion to Dismiss").

Pursuant to Rules 28-106.303(1) and 28-106.103, Florida Administrative Code, the Bright House response to Verizon's Motion to Dismiss is due on January 20, 2009. In its Motion, Bright House asks that it be granted two additional business days, until January 22, 2009, to respond to Verizon's Motion to Dismiss. The extension of time is requested in light of the upcoming Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday and the presidential inauguration, which Bright House asserts "will make it difficult for Bright House to analyze and prepare an accurate and thorough response to the two alternative requests for relief [and] the various assertions and counter claims offered in Verizon's [Motion to Dismiss]."

Counsel for Bright House represents that Verizon does not oppose this requested extension of time.


Upon consideration, Bright House's Motion for Extension of Time is granted and the time for Bright House to respond to the Verizon Motion to Dismiss and Alternative Motion for Summary Final Order is extended until January 22, 2009.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Office of Commission Clerk, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
