15 nellsouth purchases the software required for Touc'iStar features under 15 contracts with its various switch vendors. The features for all lAESS 17 switches are ourchased as a package for a flat fee of IN switch. All features are loaded at the same time and include the six 19 currently pariffed features as well as Caller ID. In the SESS switch 28 only four features (Call Return, Repeat Dialing, Call Tracing, and It caller ID) are initially available and they are purchased as a per switch mod or a price of 22 package, either at a price of 23 per line (in 100 line increments). These list prices are discounted 24 for sellSouth under existing contracts from depending on 25 various factors as specified in the AT&T/BellSouth contracts. The DMS 25 switches initially have available the same four features as the 5ESS, 27 which are purchased as individual feature packages under NTI/BellSouth 28 contracts. The prices for the features are: Call Return/Repeat ; Call Tracing-29 Dialing (purchased jointly)-. These list prices are discounted to BellSouth by discount off the discounted price 31 initially, with another 32 depending various factors as specified in the NTI/BellSouth contracts. 33 As discussed in Interrogatories 7,8, and 9, per-call blocking in the 3d One switch is an optional feature. This feature is available in the per switch (the above 35 initial DMS offering at a list price of 36 discounts are applicable).
