Dear Commissioner Wilson:

Florida Police Benevolent Association, on behalf of its 23,000 rank-and-file law enforcement members, is still concerned with the tariff Southern Bell has filed with Florida Public Service Commission to begin providing caller-I.D. service to its customers. We believe that the proposed tariff does not contain the necessary safeguards to protect our law enforcement members and their families from individuals who may wish to harm them because of their law enforcement duties.

Because there are significant officer safety issues outstanding, we have forwarded correspondence to Southern Bell requesting that its Chief Executive Officer or members of his immediate staff resume meetings with the Law Enforcement Task Force on Caller-I.D. as soon as possible. We believe the successful resolution of significant officer safety issues prior to the Public Service Commission's upcoming hearings will benefit both Southern Bell and the rank-and-file law enforcement members whom we represent.

We would appreciate any efforts you could undertake to bring Southern Bell and this Task Force back together.
