FINAL ORDER CLOSING DOCKET

BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 4, 1991, Aminur Rahman filed an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide pay telephone service. At the September 24, 1991 Agenda Conference, we elected to grant Mr. Rahman such certificate, and on November 2, 1991, we issued Order No. 25209 granting Mr. Rahman a certificate. In the meantime, Mr. Rahman had filed a request that his application be withdrawn.

Because this withdrawal was received prior to the effective date of the Order, we find that the withdrawal should be treated as a protest and that Order No. 25209 be rescinded with regard to Mr. Rahman only. By this action Mr. Rahman does not receive a certificate and no regulatory assessment fees will be imposed.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Order No. 25209 is rescinded with respect to Aminur Rahman only, and this Order shall not effect any other pay telephone service certificates granted by that Order. It is further

ORDERED that Aminur Rahman shall receive no PATS certificate and shall not be liable for any regulatory assessment fees. It is further

ORDERED that this docket shall be closed.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900 (a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
