**** APPENDIX E ****

**** GLOSSARY ****

ACCESS CODE. The term denotes a uniform four or seven digit code assigned to an individual IXC. The five digit code has the form 10XXX and the seven digit code has the form 950-10XX.

BYPASS. Transmission facilities that go direct from the local exchange end user to an IXC point of presence, thus bypassing the local exchange company.

CARRIERS CARRIER. An IXC that provides telecommunications service, mainly bulk transmission service, to other IXC only.

CENTRAL OFFICE. A local operating unit by means of which connections are established between subscribers' lines and trunk or toll lines to other central offices within the same exchange or other exchanges. Each three (3) digit central office code (NXX) used shall be considered a separate central office unit.

CENTRAL OFFICE CODE. The term denotes the first three digits (NXX) of the seven (7) digit telephone number assigned to a customer's telephone exchange service.

COMMISSION. The Florida Public Service Commission.

COMPANY, TELEPHONE COMPANY, UTILITY. These terms may be used interchangeably herein and shall mean any person, firm, partnership or corporation engaged in the business of furnishing communication service to the public under the jurisdiction of the Commission.

DEDICATED FACILITY. The term denotes a transmission circuit which is permanently for the exclusive use of a customer or a pair of customers.

END USER. The term denotes any individual, partnership, association, corporation, governmental agency or any other entity which (A) obtains a common line, uses a pay telephone or obtains interstate service arrangements in the operating territory of the company or (B) subscribes to interstate services provided by an IXC or uses the services of the IXC when the IXC provides interstate service for its own use.

EQUAL ACCESS EXCHANGE AREAS. EAEA means a geographic area, configured based on 1987 planned toll center/access tandem areas, in which local exchange companies are responsible for providing equal access to both carriers and customers of carriers in the most economically efficient manner.

EXCHANGE. The entire telephone plant and facilities used in providing telephone service to subscribers located in an exchange area. An exchange may include more than one central office unit.

EXCHANGE (SERVICE) AREA. The territory, including the base rate suburban and rural areas served by an exchange, within which local telephone service is furnished at the exchange rates applicable within that area.

EXTENDED AREA SERVICE. A type of telephone service furnished under tariff provision whereby subscribers of a given exchange or area may complete calls to, and receive messages from, one or more other contiguous exchanges without toll charges, or complete calls to one or more other exchanges without toll message charges.

FACILITIES BASED. An IXC that has its own transmission and/or switching equipment or other elements of equipment and does not rely on others to provide this service.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICES. A classification of exchange service furnished under tariff provisions whereby a subscriber may be provided telephone service from an exchange other than the one from which he would normally be served.

FEATURE GROUPS. General categories of unbundled tariffs to stipulate related services.

Feature Group A: Line side connections presently serving specialized common carriers.

Feature Group B: Trunk side connections without equal digit or code dialing.

Feature Group C: Trunk side connections presently serving AT&T-C.

Feature Group D: Equal trunk access with subscription.

INTEREXCHANGE COMPANY. means any telephone company, as defined in Section 364.02(4), F.S., which provides telecommunication service between exchange areas as those areas are described in the approved tariffs of individual local exchange companies.

INTER-OFFICE CALL. A telephone call originating in one central office unit or entity but terminating in another central office unit or entity both of which are in the same designated exchange area.

INTRA-OFFICE CALL. A telephone call originating and terminating within the same central office unit or entity.

INTRASTATE COMMUNICATIONS. The term denotes any communications in Florida subject to oversight by the Florida Public Service Commission as provided by the laws of the State.

INTRA-STATE TOLL MESSAGE. Those toll messages which originate and terminate within the same state.

LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA. LATA means the geographic area established for the administration of communications service. It encompasses designated exchanges, which are grouped to serve common social, economic and other purposes.

LOCAL EXCHANGE COMPANY. (LEC) means any telephone company, as defined in Section 364.02(4), F.S., which, in addition to any other telephonic communication service, provides telecommunication service within exchange areas as those areas are described in the approved tariffs of the telephone company.

OPTIONAL CALLING PLAN. An optional service furnished under tariff provisions which recognizes a need of some subscribers for extended area calling without imposing the cost on the entire body of subscribers.

900 SERVICE. A service similar to 800 service, except this service is charged back to the customer based on first minute plus additional minute usage.

PIN NUMBER. A group of numbers used by a company to identify their customers.

PAY TELEPHONE SERVICE COMPANY. Means any telephone company, other than a Local Exchange Company, which provides pay telephone service as defined in Section 364.335(4), F.S.

POINT OF PRESENCE (POP). Bell-coined term which designates the actual (physical) location of an IXC's facility. Replaces some applications of the term "demarcation point."

PRIMARY SERVICE. Individual line service or party line service.

RESELLER. An IXC that does not have certain facilities but purchases telecommunications service from an IXC and then resells that service to others.

STATION. A telephone instrument consisting of a transmitter, receiver, and associated apparatus so connected as to permit sending and/or receiving telephone messages.

SUBSCRIBER, CUSTOMER. These terms may be used interchangeably herein and shall mean any person, firm, partnership, corporation, municipality, cooperative organization, or governmental agency supplied with communication service by a telephone company.

SUBSCRIBER LINE. The circuit or channel used to connect the subscriber station with the central office equipment.

SWITCHING CENTER. Location at which telephone traffic, either local or toll, is switched or connected from one circuit or line to another. A local switching center may be comprised of several central office units.

TRUNK. A communication channel between central office units or entities, or private branch exchanges.





28 shareholder and the founder of VarTec. Mr. Mitchell has been

1 an innovator in the long distance telephone business for many
2 years. He received a Bachelors of Science Degree in
3 Engineering and has undertaken Masters Work in Mechanical
4 Engineering at Oklahoma State University. Mr. Mitchell was
5 the founding employee and initial President of ClayDesta
6 Communications. He managed ClayDesta Communications from

17 Manager for the prestigious William Morris Agency.
18 Additionally, Mr. Egger spent three years with Litton
19 Industries as its Senior Auditor.

20 (4) Joe Cook is Executive Vice President of Operations and
21 a shareholder in VarTec. He received a graduate Engineering
22 Degree from the USAF Institute. Mr. Cook's early
23 telecommunications career included a combined eighteen (18)
24 years of service with AT&T, GTE, and United Telephone. His
25 many duties with those telephone companies included Director
26 of Engineering and Design. Mr. Cook's long distance telephone
27 experience also includes three years in the position of Vice
28 President of Operations of SATELCO. He was also founder and

1 Vice President of Advance Telecommunications Corporation
2 (ATC), a major regional carrier in the South and Southwest
3 United States. Immediately prior to joining VarTec, Mr. Cook
4 was President of BETA Consulting, a product design and
5 acquisition corporation.

6 (5) **Oran C. Gaynor** is Vice President of Sales - Business
7 Division for VarTec. He received a Bachelors Degree in
8 Business and has completed advanced studies in marketing at
9 the University of Texas at Arlington. Prior to joining
10 VarTec, Mr. Gaynor served as Director of Sales for Metagram
11 America over the Southwestern Region of the United States.
12 His responsibility included management of over 700 sales and
13 customer services personnel in 13 cities. Mr. Gaynor's
14 information services and communications experience uniquely
15 positions him to be responsive to clients' needs and product
16 applications.

17 (6) **Connie F. Mitchell** is Assistant Secretary, Vice President
18 - Corporate Services and a shareholder in VarTec. She is a
19 founding member of VarTec and has been associated with the
20 telecommunications industry since 1987. Ms. Mitchell received
21 a Bachelors Degree in Accounting and Education from Oklahoma
22 State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma and has completed the
23 majority of her Masters Degree in Business Administration
24 (MBA) through Nova University. Ms. Mitchell's
25 responsibilities at VarTec include customer services,
26 marketing support, and personnel. Her current role at VarTec
27 is well-suited due to her MBA work in personnel, statistical
28 community analysis and financial management. Prior to her

1 telecommunications career, Ms. Mitchell spent fifteen (15)
2 years in the field of higher education in both accounting and
3 administration. The higher education segment of her career
4 culminated in the position of Associated Dean of Midland
5 College in Midland, Texas. In this position Ms. Mitchell
6 specialized in the accreditation and funding of federal
7 programs enhancing local marketing support to such business
8 segments as manufacturing, distribution, retail, banking and
9 finance as well as the newly deregulated telecommunications
10 industry.

11 (7) **Mike Harris** is Corporate Accounts Manager at VarTec. Mr.
12 Harris has over seven (7) years experience in the
13 telecommunications industry with the bulk of it in sales to
14 large corporate DS1-type clients. Mr. Harris received a
15 Bachelors of Arts Degree in Marketing from Texas Wesleyan
16 University. Prior to VarTec, Mr. Harris spent a three and one
17 half year period with Telecom*USA where he was instrumental
18 in establishing the initial office and client base for the
19 Dallas/Fort Worth marketplace. He was also instrumental in
20 transitioning this base to MCI after the 1990 acquisition of
21 Telecom*USA by MCI. VarTec considers Mr. Harris an excellent
22 acquisition from MCI as evidenced not only by his track record
23 with VarTec, but also, by the fact that he was one of very few
24 Telecom*USA employees retained by MCI.

25 (8) **Bruce L. Boretsky** is Vice President of Marketing and a
26 shareholder in VarTec. Prior to holding this position, Mr.
27 Boretsky acted as a Marketing Consultant to VarTec between
28 February 1990 and January 1, 1991. Mr. Boretsky received his

1 Bachelors of Arts Degree in Political Science from the
2 University of Iowa. He also has attended Iowa State
3 University and performed one and one half years of post-
4 graduate work at Creighton University College of Law. Mr.
5 Boretsky has served in various marketing management and
6 executive positions for over ten years, the last five of which
7 have been in the long distance telephone industry. Prior to
8 joining VarTec, Mr. Boretsky held positions including Vice
9 President of Market Expansion and Vice President of Marketing
10 for the Teleconnect Division of Telecom*USA, now part of MCI
11 via acquisition. While at Teleconnect, Mr. Boretsky managed
12 the initial expansion marketing and sales efforts to grow
13 Teleconnect from a 4 to a 33 state sales area within an 18
14 month period. In addition, Mr. Boretsky supervised a
15 telemarketing operation of over 600 people, and built and
16 managed a nationwide network of approximately 350 dealers.
17 Mr. Boretsky's management responsibilities at Teleconnect
18 included business units with combined annual revenues of over
19 \$110 million.

20 Q. HOW LONG HAS VARTEC BEEN IN BUSINESS?

21 A. VarTec was incorporated in the State of Texas on February 27,
22 1989.

23 Q. DOES VARTEC HAVE OFFICES IN FLORIDA?

24 A. No. There is no need to do so. VarTec intends to use direct
25 mailings or telemarketing to sell its services to customers
26 in Florida.

27 Q. WHY HAS VARTEC FILED THIS APPLICATION?

1 A. VarTec's unique Toll-SaverSM and Travel Card offerings have
2 found a wide acceptance among residential users across the
3 nation. VarTec is therefore engaged in programmed expansion
4 of its operations to meet demand. As part of its expansion
5 program, VarTec is obtaining certification in all those states
6 which require it in order that VarTec's provision of
7 intrastate service is authorized and in compliance with all
8 state regulatory requirements.

9 Q. DOES VARTEC PRESENTLY OFFER OR PROVIDE INTRASTATE SERVICE IN
10 FLORIDA?

11 A. No.

12 Q. PLEASE BRIEFLY DESCRIBE VARTEC'S TOLL-SAVERSM SERVICE.

13 A. Toll-SaverSM Service is a non-operator-assisted, direct-dial
14 long distance telephone service offered to both residential
15 and business customers. Customers access VarTec's Toll-
16 SaverSM Service via equal access Feature Group D circuits
17 and/or other switched access services. When VarTec is not the
18 presubscribed interexchange carrier, end users can access
19 Toll-SaverSM Service by dialing 10811 + 1 + (area code when
20 necessary) + NXX+XXXX. VarTec's Toll-SaverSM Service includes
21 a frequent caller program that enables consumers to place long
22 distance telephone calls for only one penny. For every ten
23 U.S. long distance calls that are made by a consumer, that
24 customer will receive another long distance call for only one
25 penny. The one penny calls can be up to ten minutes in
26 duration and can be made to anywhere within the continental
27 U.S., excluding Alaska. Customers are not required to sign
28 up for VarTec's Toll-SaverSM Service. To receive these one

1 penny calls, consumers can use VarTec's Toll-SaverSM Service
2 by simply dialing 10811 each time they make a long distance
3 telephone call. Furthermore, there are no minimum usage
4 requirements or monthly service charges associated with
5 VarTec's Toll-SaverSM Service. If a customer is not satisfied
6 with the quality of VarTec's Toll-SaverSM Service, the consumer
7 may discontinue the use of the VarTec Toll-SaverSM 10811 number
8 without any further obligation.

9 Q. PLEASE BRIEFLY DESCRIBE VARTEC'S TRAVEL CARD SERVICE.

10 A. VarTec's Travel Card Service will permit customers to make
11 calls from any location within Florida to any other location
12 within Florida by dialing 1+800+383+2255, receiving a signal
13 tone, then dialing in the customer's personal identification
14 number assigned by VarTec followed by the telephone number of
15 the called party within Florida. This Travel Card Service
16 makes long distance calling more convenient for customers by
17 enabling them to place long distance telephone calls while
18 they are away from home. Furthermore, VarTec offers volume
19 discounts for its Travel Card Service.

20 Q. IS VARTEC PROPOSING TO PROVIDE INTRASTATE OPERATOR SERVICES
21 IN FLORIDA?

22 A. No. AT&T and Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company
23 provide directory assistance service to VarTec and bill VarTec
24 a directory assistance charge. VarTec proposes to bill its
25 customers a per call rate to flow through the charge that AT&T
26 and Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company bill VarTec
27 for providing this directory assistance service.

28 Q. DOES VARTEC OFFER OPERATOR SERVICES IN OTHER STATES?

1 A. No.

2 Q. DOES VARTEC PROVIDE PAY PHONE SERVICE?

3 A. No.

4 Q. IS VARTEC CERTIFICATED OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE
5 INTRASTATE RESALE SERVICES OF THE TYPE DESCRIBED HEREIN IN ANY
6 OTHER STATES?

7 A. Yes. VarTec has already complied with requirements in such
8 states as Texas, Oklahoma and Missouri. VarTec's application
9 for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in
10 Kansas has been filed and is pending.

11 Q. IS VARTEC FINANCIALLY QUALIFIED TO PROVIDE THE SERVICE FOR
12 WHICH IT SEEKS A CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND
13 NECESSITY?

14 A. Yes. I believe that VarTec has the financial ability to
15 render the proposed telecommunication services. The growing
16 interest in the frequent caller program for VarTec's Toll-
17 SaverSM Service resulted in a very profitable year for VarTec
18 in 1991. I anticipate a similar demand for such lower-priced
19 long distance calling in Florida and expect VarTec's success
20 to continue.

21 VarTec also receives substantial financial and technical
22 support from its majority stockholder, Telephone Electronics
23 Corporation. Telephone Electronics Corporation owns 80% of
24 VarTec's stock. Telephone Electronics Corporation is one of
25 the largest privately-owned telecommunications firms. The
26 organization's roots date back to 1923, with the purchase of
27 the 120 local subscriber Bay Springs Telephone Company, Inc.
28 by D.L. Fail and his wife Estelle. Telephone Electronics

1 Corporation was incorporated in Mississippi in 1972. In the
2 highly competitive telecommunications industry, Telephone
3 Electronics Corporation has emerged as a leader in developing
4 technologies among independent local exchange carriers and
5 interexchange service resellers. Telephone Electronics
6 Corporation owns and operates independent local exchange
7 carriers, cable television and cellular operations and long
8 distance companies providing service in several states.

9 Q. IN YOUR OPINION, WHY IS VARTEC'S SERVICE IN THE PUBLIC
10 INTEREST?

11 A. VarTec's commencement of service in Florida builds on the
12 longstanding regulatory policies which created and maintained
13 the principles of resale services in general. That is, resale
14 telecommunications services expands the availability of
15 telecommunications services to more members of the public and
16 at more competitive prices. The competition that VarTec will
17 bring to the interexchange market will benefit all consumers
18 generally, and residential customers specifically, by offering
19 the public a greater choice and a more reliable and
20 diversified supply of alternative telecommunications services
21 with enhanced quality and at lower prices. Such competition
22 will provide the incentive for competitive interexchange
23 carriers to offer their services at lower prices resulting in
24 significant cost savings to consumers, and will spur the
25 development of innovative service and equipment offerings as
26 new competitors attempt to attract new subscribers. VarTec's
27 concentration on the residential market will provide such
28 consumers with a service provider that is focused on the

1 specific needs and requirements of such consumers and that has
2 tailored its service offerings to meet such needs and
3 requirements. VarTec will enable residential customers to
4 retain the benefits of price and quality that VarTec offers
5 while away from home through the use of its Travel Card. The
6 lease by VarTec of transmission and switching capacity will
7 result in the more efficient use of existing telecommunica-
8 tions plant in Florida without further investment in the
9 construction of new, excess facilities and capacity.

10 Q. DOES THIS COMPLETE YOUR PREFILED TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF
11 VARTEC'S APPLICATION?

12 A. Yes, it does.

13 Q. WILL YOU REMAIN AVAILABLE TO RESPOND TO ANY ADDITIONAL
14 QUESTIONS FROM THE COMMISSION OR ITS STAFF ABOUT THAT
15 APPLICATION OR THE COMPANY?

2.7 End User Complaints

2.8.1 Payment for Service

VTN does not perform its own billing. All charges due by the Customer are payable to any agency duly authorized to receive such payments. The billing agency may be a local exchange telephone company, credit card company, or other billing service. Terms of payment shall be according to the rules and regulations of the agency and subject to the rules of regulatory agencies, such as the Florida Public Service Commission. - 2.9.1 In the event service is temporarily suspended for non-payment such service will be restored upon payment of all charges due for regulated services.

2.11.1 Extra Copies of Bill

Extra Copies of an end user's monthly bill will be provided by the Carrier at the rate specified in this tariff.

2.11.2 Fraud

The Company shall have the right to refuse or discontinue service if the acts of the end user/customer, including furnishing false credit information or the conditions upon their premises are such as to indicate intention to defraud the Company.

2.11.3 Non Compliance with the Company's Rules

The Company may discontinue service if an end user/customer fails to comply with any of the rules herein upon notice in compliance with the Commission's rules.

2.11.4 Telephone Calls with Intent to Annoy

The Company may discontinue service of any end user/customer who, with intent to annoy, telephones another and addresses to or about such other person any obscene language or addresses to such other person any threat to inflict injury to the person or property of the person addressed or any family member, upon notice in compliance with the Commission's rules.

The Company may discontinue service of any end user/customer who, with intent to annoy, repeatedly telephones another without disclosing his true identity to the person answering the telephone, whether or not conversation ensues during the telephone calls, upon notice in compliance with the Commission's rules.

2.12 Discontinuance and Restoration of Service

2.12.1 Intentional Abuse of Service

The Company has the right to refuse telephone service to any premises and at any time to discontinue telephone service, if it finds it necessary to do so to protect itself against intentional abuse. Intentional abuse of service includes, without limiting the generality of the foregoing; the use of service or facilities of the Company to transmit a message or to locate a person or otherwise to give or obtain information, without payment of a message toll charge or an exchange service charge.

2.12.2 Disconnection - Without Prior Notice

Interexchange service may be refused or disconnected without prior notice by VTN for the following reasons:

- A. In the event of a condition on the end user's/customer's premises determined by VTN to be hazardous.
- B. In the event of end user's/customer's use in such a manner as to adversely affect VTN's facilities or VTN's service to others.
- C. In the event of tampering with facilities leased or owned by VTN.
- D. In the event of interexchange service being used by an end user in connection with a plan or contrivance to secure a large volume of interexchange calls to be directed to such end user or the telephone service of any designated customer at or about the same time, resulting in preventing, obstructing or delaying the interexchange service of others.

3.1 General

The Carrier endeavors to provide high quality service. Service is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, subject to routine maintenance and outages beyond the control of the Carrier. Carrier's switching equipment is designed and engineered to provide high quality transmission of voice and data with a minimum level of impairment such as noise and echo. However, overall quality may vary somewhat due to the variability in quality of the connections provided by the local telephone companies and other interexchange carriers which is beyond the Company's control.

3.2 Timing of Calls

(A) Long distance usage charges are based on the actual usage of VTN's network. No charge will apply to incompleted calls, which include "ring busy" and "ring no answer calls", and such incompleted calls will not be knowingly charged to the customer and, if charged in error, will be refundable to the customer. VTN will determine that a call has been established by signal from the local telephone company.

(B) Unless otherwise specified in this tariff, the minimum call duration for billing purposes is 1 minute for a connected call.

(C) Unless otherwise specified in this tariff, usage is measured and rounded to the higher full minute for billing purposes.

(D) When answer supervision is unavailable and VTN has received a reasonable claim from the end user for a refund of VTN's charges for an uncompleted call, VTN will reimburse the end user for the charges that VTN has billed for that call.

3.3 Service Area

3.4 Calculation of Distance

(A) Usage charges for all mileage sensitive products are based on the airline distance between rate centers associated with the originating and terminating points of the call.

(B) The Rate Centers of a call are determined by the area codes and exchanges of the origination and destination points.

(C) The distance between the Rate Center of the Customer's equipment and that of the destination point is calculated by using the "V" and "H" coordinates found in AT&T FCC Tariff No. 10, in the following manner:

Step 1 - Obtain the "V" and "H" coordinates for the Rate Centers of the Customer's switch and the destination point.

Step 2 - Obtain the difference between the "V" coordinates of each of the Rate Centers. Obtain the difference between the "H" coordinates.

Step 3 - Square the differences obtained in Step 2.

Step 4 - Add the squares of the "V" difference and "H" difference obtained in Step 3.

Step 5 - Divide the sum of the square obtained in Step 4 by ten (10). Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction results from the division.

Step 6 - Obtain the square root of the whole number obtained in Step 5. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained. This is the distance between the Rate Centers.

3.5 Toll-SaverSM Service

Toll-SaverSM Service (non-operator assisted, direct-dial) is offered to end user/customers, including but not limited to, residential and business end users/customers, for calling within the State of Florida. End users/customers access VarTec National, Inc. dba/VarTec Telecom, Inc.SM via Equal Access FGD circuits and/or other Switched Access Services. When VTN is not the presubscribed interexchange carrier, end users can access Toll-SaverSM Service by dialing 10811 + 1 + area code + NXX - XXXX. Calls are routed over the Company's transmission and switching facilities to any valid NPA-NXX in the State of Florida. Rates and charges for VTN's Toll-SaverSM Service are set forth in Sections 4.1 and 4.2 following.

Customers of VTN's Toll-SaverSM Service will be eligible for VTN's Frequent Caller program. For every ten U.S. long distance calls a end user/customer makes, by dialing 10811 plus 1 and the area code (if required) + NXX-XXXX, the end user/customer will receive another long distance Toll-SaverSM Service call for only one (\$.01) cent. The one (\$.01) cent calls can be up to ten minutes in duration and can be made anywhere within the continental U.S. (excluding Alaska and Hawaii).

Calls are rated based on mileage, time of day and call duration.

- 3) **Group Accounts** - for the end user/customer who requires many travel cards and regularly bills more than \$500 in travel calls per month.

Customer shall configure its PBX or other switch vehicle from which a customer places a call so that 911 emergency calls, where available, and similar emergency calls will be automatically routed to the emergency answering point for the geographical location where the call originated without the intervention of VTN.

4.5.1 Standard Emergency Operating Procedures

911 calls are not routed but are completed through the local network. No billing applies to emergency calls.

4.6 Restoral of Service Charge

In the event service is temporarily suspended for non-payment such service will be restored upon payment of all charges due.

A restoral of service charge will be applicable for each authorization code temporarily suspended. Where service is presubscribed to VTN's service a restoral of service charge will be applicable for each line temporarily suspended.

End Users/customers not reestablished within five (5) days from date of suspension will be treated as a new customer and appropriate Nonrecurring Charges and an advance payment will apply.

4.7 Returned Check Charge

When payment in the form of a bank check for services rendered is returned to the carrier, the end user/customer will be assessed a service charge of \$15.00 to cover the cost of handling the check.

4.8 Extra Copies of Bill

Extra copies of an end user's/customer's monthly bill will be provided by the Carrier at the rate of \$.25 per copy, per page, a minimum of \$1.00 will apply.

4.9 Service Trip Charge

Upon the individual end user's/customer's request and upon VTN's subsequent notification to the end user/customer of the associated tariff charge on file with the Commission, VTN will perform a service check. If the trouble cannot be isolated, no service trip charge will apply. A Service Trip Charge of \$50.00 may be assessed for the service check when the difficulty is associated with customer-provided terminal equipment or other equipment not provided by VTN.

4.10 Travel Card Service

The following surcharge per call and per minute rates are for Travel Card Services.

- Individual Accounts - Surcharge per call is \$0.50.
- Per minute rate is \$0.26.
- Corporate Accounts - Surcharge per call is \$0.30.
