ORDER APPROVING TARIFF FILINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

Pursuant to Order No. 25601, issued on March 30, 1992, in Docket No. 910800, St. Joseph Telephone and Telegraph Company filed a tariff to introduce Operator Transfer Service (OTS). On April 1, 1992, GTE Florida Incorporated filed its OTS tariff in compliance with the same Order.

The tariff filings are substantially the same as to previous OTS filings which we have approved. OTS allows the local exchange company operators to transfer end user dialed 0- calls to participating access carrier customers designated by the caller. Upon consideration, we approve the instant tariff filings to introduce OTS.

Based upon the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the Operator Transfer Service tariff filings by St. Joseph Telephone and Telegraph Company and GTE Florida Incorporated are hereby approved. It is further

ORDERED that these tariffs shall become effective on May 30, 1992. It is further

ORDERED that the dockets shall be closed at the end of the protest period assuming no timely protest is filed. It is further

DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

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ORDERED that if a timely protest is filed, these tariffs shall remain in effect with any increase in revenues held subject to refund pending resolution of the protest. It is further

ORDERED that a protest to one docket shall not prevent the closing of the other docket.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The Commission's decision on this tariff is interim in nature and will become final, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed files a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.036(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on June 16, 1992.

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In the absence of such a petition, this Order shall become final on the day subsequent to the above date.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this Order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this Order becomes final on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the date this Order becomes final, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
