

United Telephone Company of Florida ("United" or the "Company"), by and through its undersigned counsel, and in accordance with Section 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, files this Request for Confidential Classification, and says:

1. United requests that the documents attached hereto as Attachment "A" be classified as "proprietary confidential business information" within the meaning of Section 364.183, Florida Statutes (1991). Attachment "A" is an edited version of the documents on which the information asserted to be confidential has been blocked out by the use of an opaque marker. An unedited version of the document included in Attachment "A" has previously been submitted to the Division of Records and Reporting on September 1, 1993, with the information asserted to be confidential highlighted in yellow.

2. The document in Attachment "A" was provided to the Division of Records and Reporting, together with a Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification, on September 1, 1993. This document is the Company's Answer to Staff's Interrogatory No. 63, which answer was filed and served (with the confidential information redacted) on September 1, 1993.

The document in Attachment "A" contains the Company's total number of access lines in service per central office, and the total number of private lines and special access lines per central office in service. In its initial response to Staff's Interrogatory No. 63, the Company requested confidential treatment of the total number of access lines per central office, as well as the total number of private lines and special access lines per central office. In this request for confidential classification, United is only requesting that the total number of private lines and special access lines per central office be classified as confidential business information. The highlighted and redacted portions of this document should be considered confidential because disclosure of that information would harm the Company's ratepayers and/or the business operations of the Company.

4. The line-by-line and page-by-page justification required by Section 25-22.006(4), Florida Administrative code, including statements concerning how the ratepayers and/or the business operations of the Company will be harmed if this information is disclosed to the public, is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Attachment "B."


5. The information in Attachment "A" is intended to be and is treated by United as private, confidential information and has not been disclosed to the public.

**Note 1:** This document shows the Company's most recent (1993) count of private lines and special access lines by Company central office. Disclosing such private line and special access line information to the public would give the Company's competitors precise information about the size of the Company's private line and special access market and will allow those competitors to make informed decisions about whether and how to compete with the Company in given central office locations for these services.

The Company's competitors should be required to develop their own marketing data using their own personnel and resources rather than the Company's. This information is valuable, is or will be used by the Company to make competitive business decisions, and should be exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.
