

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

**PETITION OF FLORIDA POWER CORPORATION  
FOR APPROVAL AND AUTHORIZATION OF  
CONSERVATION COST RECOVERY FACTOR**

Petitioner, Florida Power Corporation (FPC), by and through its undersigned counsel and pursuant to the provisions of Fla. Stat. §366.82(5) and Commission Rule 25-17.015 hereby petitions the Commission to approve the following cents per kWh for Residential and General Service Non-Demand (secondary voltage) 0.331, (primary voltage) 0.328, (transmission voltage) 0.324; General Service 100% Load Factor (secondary voltage) 0.203; General Service Demand (secondary voltage) 0.238, (primary voltage) 0.236, (transmission voltage) 0.233; Curtailable (secondary voltage) 0.207, (primary voltage) 0.205, (transmission voltage) 0.203; Interruptible (secondary voltage) 0.208, (primary voltage) 0.206, (transmission voltage) 0.204; and Lighting (secondary voltage) 0.104, as FPC's conservation cost recovery factors by retail rate class for the April 1, 1995 through March 31, 1996 billing period to be effective on April 1, 1995 and to continue said charges as FPC's conservation adjustment until modified by subsequent order. In support thereof, Florida Power Corporation states the following:

1. The conservation cost recovery factors as listed above per kWh for the April billing period were computed in accordance with Commission Rule 25-17.015, and the directions of the Commission in this docket. The calculations are contained in the attached direct testimony of P. D. Cleveland, in a form previously approved by the Commission. The factors in cents per kWh represent the charge necessary, when applied to projected retail rate class kWh sales for the twelve-month period, to recover the conservation costs projected to be incurred and to accommodate the true-up calculations from the previous recovery period April 1, 1994 through March 31, 1995.


2. The true-up calculations, showing an over-recovery of \$4,702,955 reflect actual cost information for the period October 1, 1994 through November 30, 1994 and estimated data for December 1, 1994 through March 31, 1995.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner for the reasons set forth above, requests this Commission to approve conservation cost recovery factors by retail rate class in cents per kWh for Residential and General Service Non-Demand (secondary voltage) 0.331, (primary voltage) 0.328, (transmission voltage) 0.324; General Service 100% Load Factor (secondary voltage) 0.203; General Service Demand (secondary voltage) 0.238, (primary voltage) 0.236, (transmission voltage) 0.233; Curtailable (secondary voltage) 0.207, (primary voltage) 0.205, (transmission voltage) 0.203; Interruptible (secondary voltage) 0.208, (primary voltage) 0.206, (transmission voltage) 0.204; and Lighting (secondary voltage) 0.104, as the conservation cost recovery charges for the April 1, 1995 through March 31, 1996 billing period, to be effective starting April 1, 1995.
