## PROCEEDINGS

(Hearing convened at 1:35 p.m.)

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Call the prehearing conference to order.

First of all, let me apologize for the slight delay and the fact that we're meeting in a different room; but as I'm sure everyone is aware, the internal affairs that we had scheduled for today proceeded longer than we first envisioned. And with that, we'll begin with having the notice read.

MS. BROWN: By notice issued February 10th,

1995, this time and place was set for a prehearing

conference in the following dockets: Docket

No. 950001-EI, Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Recovery

Clause with Generating Performance Incentive Factor;

Docket No. 950002-EG, Energy Conservation Cost Recovery

Clause; Docket No. 950003-GU, Purchased Gas Cost

Recovery Clause; and Docket No. 950007-EI, Environmental

Cost Recovery Clause. The purpose of the prehearing

conference is described in the notice.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay. We'll take appearances at this time.

MR. HOWE: Commissioner Deason, I'm Roger Howe with the Office of Public Counsel, appearing on behalf of the Citizens of the State of Florida in the 01, 02,

03 and 07 dockets.

MS. KAUFMAN: Vicki Gordon Kaufman, McWhirter, Reeves, McGlothlin, Davidson and Bakas, 315 South Calhoun Street, Suite 716, Tallahassee 32301. I'm appearing on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group in the 0001, 0002 and 0007 dockets.

MR. BADDERS: Russell A. Badders, Beggs &
Lane, 3 West Garden Street, P.O. Box 12950, Pensacola,
Florida 32576. I'm appearing on behalf of Gulf Power
Company in the 0001, 02 and 07 dockets. I'm also making
an appearance on behalf of Jeffrey Stone.

MS. BROWN: Martha Carter Brown and Vicki D.

Johnson for the Florida Public Service Commission Staff
in the 01 and 07 dockets.

MR. PRUITT: And I'm Prentice P. Pruitt, counsel for the Commissioners.

MR. CHILDS: Commissioner, my name is Matthew Childs with the firm of Steel, Hector and Davis. I'm appearing on behalf of Florida Power & Light Company in the environmental cost recovery and fuel adjustment dockets.

Thank you.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay, very well. Any other appearances?

Here again, I apologize for the cramped

quarters, so we are going to have to be sharing microphones. But perhaps some of the dockets that are a little less controversial, we may get to proceed through those quite quickly.

Ms. Brown?

MS. BROWN: Commissioner Deason, it appears to us at this point that the 03 and 07 dockets may be the least controversial, and we suggest that we do those first.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: We will move, then, into the 07 docket.

MS. BROWN: Mr. Chairman, we have, I think, almost a completely stipulated case in the environmental cost recovery clause with one minor exception -- at least Staff and the companies. We need to discuss with OPC and FIPUG their positions with respect to 9A. That issue is: "Should the Commission approve Gulf Power Company's request to recover the cost for dismantlement associated with ECRC investments through the Environmental Cost Recovery Clause?"

It's my understanding that Gulf agrees with
Staff and is willing to defer this issue for
consideration in the August fuel hearing. We would like
the position of that issue to be Staff's wording, if

7 that's satisfactory with everyone. 1 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Is there any objection, 2 then, that the position for Issue 9A for both Gulf and 3 | for Staff would be basically deferral? And I guess my 4 question is, are there any other positions contrary to 5 those which need to be included into the Prehearing Order? 7 I take it, then, with that, the issue 8 basically will be deferred, and then there will be no 9 controversy, at least for this hearing coming up, for Issue 9A. 11 MS. BROWN: That's correct. 12 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay. 13 MS. BROWN: And I would ask OPC and FIPUG if 14 they have any particular problems with any of the other 15 issues at this time. 16 MS. KAUFMAN: No, FIPUG doesn't, and we would 17 just maintain our "No position" on those issues. 18 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Mr. Howe? 19 MR. HOWE: I might need a little bit of 20 clarification. For example, Staff has taken the 21

position on these various issues with respect to Gulf. For example, Issue No. 1 --

> MS. BROWN: Yes.

MR. HOWE: -- Staff's position is, "No

position pending resolution of other issues." So 1 I'd like to know where Staff is on those other 2 3 issues. Well, I'm not sure what -- I think MS. BROWN: 4 5 Staff and Gulf have agreed to the positions on the other issues, and our numbers will be fallout numbers from 6 7 that. MR. HOWE: Would that include -- let me find 8 the issue -- Issue 9D, recovery of meal costs through 9 the environmental cost recovery clause? 10 MS. BROWN: Yes. 11 Mr. Badders, do you want to address that? 12 It's my understanding that Gulf agrees with Staff's 13 language. 14 MR. BADDERS: That's correct, we do. We agree 15 with Staff's language on that. 16 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Mr. Howe, are you in 17 agreement with that position, or do you have a question 18 or a controversy? 19 MR. HOWE: I think on Issue 9D, Commissioner 20 Deason, Public Counsel would just change the position to 21 "No position," and let it go forward with the agreement 22 between the Staff and the utility. 23

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Well, then, can I make the assumption that for both FIPUG and for the Public

Counsel's Office that their position is now currently 1 stating, "No position at this time," that that would be 2 changed to, "No position," period? 3 MR. HOWE: Yes, sir. 4 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. 5 MS. BROWN: Mr. Chairman, I do need to mention 6 one other thing. There is sort of a combination issue 7 in fuel and in environmental. It has to do with the 8 proper place to recover SO2 emission allowances. 91 It's Staff's position in 01 that if a company 10 participates in the environmental cost recovery clause, that those allowances should be recovered through that 12 clause. If a company does not participate in the 13 environmental cost recovery clause, those costs should 14 be recovered through fuel. The decision on that issue 15 will affect Gulf's factors. 16 COMMISSIONER DEASON: But it would be fallout 17 calculations. 18 MS. BROWN: It is a fallout calculation. I 19 just wanted to make you aware of that. 20 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Mr. Childs? 21 MR. CHILDS: Could I ask a question on that 22 issue and position? 23 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Could you come to a 24

microphone, please?

MR. CHILDS: I assume, as to your proposal for
the SO2 credits, that when we are talking about
purchased power that may include SO2 credits,
particularly when they are not independently itemized
but are included in the price, that those would continue
to be recovered through fuel?

MS. BROWN: Let me ask my Staff people on that. (Pause)

The answer is yes.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Any other questions or clarifications or comments concerning the 07 docket?

I take it then, with the changes that we've discussed, that essentially the 07 docket can be stipulated?

MS. BROWN: Yes.

procedure that we just followed for 03 will be followed for 07, that will be reflected in the Prehearing Order. And the prefiled testimony will be inserted into the record, and cross examination will be waived, and the Commission will have a full and complete record upon which to base its decision. And the witnesses which have prefiled testimony in 07 may be excused and will not have to appear at the hearing in the 07 docket.
