The purpose of this letter is to request your approval of a test year pursuant to Rule 25-30.430, F.A.C., for a forthcoming application for increased water and wastewater rates by Palm Coast Utility Corporation (PCUC). The reason for such an application is that the rates currently being charged will not cover both the costs of providing service and a fair return on PCUC's current and projected investment in utility property.

For the purposes of its application, PCUC proposes using a projected year end test year ending December 31, 1995, with an historical base year ended December 31, 1994. The projected test year will be composed of six menths actual data and six months projected data.

Additions to the wastewater treatment and disposal facilities, significantly increasing their capacity, have been completed and are providing service in the second half of 1995. A projected year end test year for the twelve months ending December 31,1995 will be more representative of PCUC's investment and operating expenses and conditions than the historical base period and is necessary if the revenue requirements are to reflect PCUC's costs for the period of time when the adjusted rates would be in effect.

The last full consideration of PCUC's revenue requirement was in Docket No. 890277-WS resulting in the issuance of Order No. 22843 on April 23, 1990. A test year ended December 31, 1988 was used in that docket. Since the December 31, 1988 test year and through the present, PCUC will have added approximately \$17.9

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million in water facilities, \$16.1 million in wastewater facilities and \$2.6 million in general plant. Of these amounts, approximately \$3.3 million in water facilities, \$9.1 million in wastewater facilities and \$0.7 million in general plant have been added in the most recent 18 month period. A significant portion of the added investment was necessary to increase the capacity of PCUC's water and wastewater treatment facilities and associated effluent disposal and reclaimed water reuse facilities.

In addition to the increase in plant investment, PCUC has experienced changes in its operations associated with the expansion of its facilities, as well as significant customer growth, that have resulted in increases in its O&M expenses.

The increase in investment and expenses is associated with PCUC's efforts to expand and operate its system in a manner consistent with rules, regulations, orders or regulatory directives of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the St. Johns River Water Management District, Flagler County and other state and federal agencies.

PCUC intends to file its rate application no later than December 31, 1995.
