NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION**

BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., ("BellSouth", "Southern Bell," or "Company"), hereby files pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, its Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification.

1. During the course of the above-styled docket, certain documents for which Southern Bell claimed privilege were provided to the Commission for in-camera inspection. These include employee's statements, Human Resources' work notes, and audit and panel recommendations.

2. After the Commission rejected Southern Bell's claim of privilege, Southern Bell appealed to the Florida Supreme Court. On March 10, 1994, the Supreme Court issued its ruling on Southern Bell's consolidated appeals. Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company v. Deason, 632 So.2d 1377 (Fla. 1994). On April 8, 1994, Southern Bell filed a motion for return of the documents held in-camera. The Commission declined to return the documents (See, Order No. PSC-94-0672-PCO-TL, dated June 3, 1994), and Southern Bell subsequently filed an appeal.

3. The decision of the Florida Supreme Court on this second appeal was issued on this date. Since these documents continue to

be held by the Commission, some or all of them may be deemed to be subject to the public records disclosure requirements of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The information contained in these documents, however, is proprietary information that is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to the provisions of Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.

4. Accordingly, Southern Bell hereby gives its notice of intent to file a request for confidential classification of these documents. The original of this notice has been filed with the Division of Records and Reporting, and a copy has been served on the Division requesting the information.
