ATTACHMENT VI

Common water usage **will not** be billed to the residents of Banyan Bay Apartments.

ATTACHMENT VII

The Banyan Bay Apartments policy for additional fees and charges shall be as follows:

1. **Non-sufficient funds fee** Any resident who's check is returned from the bank for lack of funds will be charged a NFS fee of \$ 25.00.
