Following completion of the initial capitalization of Merlot and the acquisition of World Pass, the Company intends to elect two additional persons, each of whom will be independent directors, to the Company's Board of Directors.

Lawrence D. Ferk, a co-founder of the Company, has served as Chairman of the Board and Director since the Company's formation in July 1996. Mr. Ferk is currently President and Chief Executive Officer of Metrolink, Inc. and has served in this capacity since 1987. Metrolink is a direct sales agent for Long Distance Savers, Inc. and U.S. Access, Inc.; both companies are private switch based U.S. long distance carriers. Prior to 1987, Mr. Ferk was President of City Pairs, Inc., a Florida based company which had the exclusive right to sell fiber-optic capacity for Microtel, Inc. Mr. Ferk has been in the telecommunications industry since 1977 when, as a regional manager, he opened the Texas and Louisiana markets for U.S. Sprint. Mr. Ferk has over 19 years experience in the telecommunications industry.

Scott I. Drake, a co-founder of the Company, has served as President and Director since its formation in July 1996. Prior to joining the Company, Mr. Drake was Chief Financial Officer of TresCom International, Inc. from December 1994 to June 1996. From June 1993 to November 1994, Mr. Drake was a Vice President of LDDS Communications, Inc, and from January 1992 to June 1993, Mr. Drake was an associate at the Breckenridge Group, an investment banking firm. Mr. Drake has been in the telecommunications industry since 1984 and has over twelve years experience in telecommunications.

Charles Wainer has served as Vice President of Network Operations of World Pass Communications Corporation since February 1993. From March 1988 to February 1993, Mr. Wainer served as Vice President of Engineering of LMC Research, Inc., a company that he founded that developed early voice mail applications. From December 1985 to January 1988, Mr. Wainer served as Service Manager for IDS Communications, Inc. Prior to December 1985, Mr. Wainer was employed by Telrad Telecom as Director of Technical Support from March 1984 to January 1985. Mr. Wainer (a U.S. citizen) was raised and educated in Argentina and Israel. He served in the Israeli Army for four years and fluently speaks, reads and writes in English, Spanish and Hebrew.

Jose Schwarzer has served as Chief Financial Officer of World Pass since April 1996. Prior to joining World Pass, Mr. Schwarzer was employed as a Senior Accountant with Alberni & Alberni, CPA's from July 1991 to April 1996. From October 1985 to February 1991, Mr. Schwarzer was a Senior Accountant with Caspy & Caspy, CPA's in Israel. 
