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

If the parties have typographical errors and they want to get back with me 4 5 by noon tomorrow we could handle it that way. CHAIRMAN CLARK: Okay. But you have some 6 changes to make. 7 MS. BARONE: I have one change to make to 8 the case background. The sentence beginning with "The 9 FCC order sets forth a cost recovery mechanism." Ι 10 would change that to "The FCC order discusses a cost 11 recovery mechanism for temporary number portability." 12 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Okay. Do you have any 13 further changes? 14 15 MS. BARONE: No, ma'am. CHAIRMAN CLARK: Ms. White, any changes 16 other than typographical that you want to give to 17 Ms. Barone? 18 I think the only thing is 19 MS. WHITE: Yes. in connection with what Monica just changed. The FCC 20 order really didn't set or pick a particular cost 21 recovery mechanism. So I would ask that it be changed 22 to state "The FCC's order discusses cost recovery for 23 temporary number portability." 24 I believe that's what I said. 25 MS. BARONE:

CHAIRMAN CLARK: If there's no objection to 6 7 that, I think that would be a good idea so then the Order would reflect the order of the direct testimony 8

9 and then the person just gives their rebuttal at the 10 same time. Okay? And you will make sure the 11 Commissioners know that.

MS. BARONE: Yes, ma'am.

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Thank you. 13 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Ms. Arluk. I request that in the MS. ARLUK: Yes. 14 15 Order of Witnesses section, that Alex J. Harris be "appearing for" instead of "issued to" all issues. 16 17 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Okay. Mr. Logan. MR. LOGAN: Yes, Commissioner. I just 18 wanted to note, and I think maybe we've taken care of 19 that in combining direct and rebuttal, but Mr. Guedel 20 21 had rebuttal testimony as well.

22 MS. BARONE: That will be reflected in the 23 order, Chairman.

24CHAIRMAN CLARK: I don't have my calendar25with me. When is the hearing in this case scheduled

1 for? November 25th. 2 MS. BARONE: 3 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Okay. That's Monday, 4 right? 5 MS. BARONE: Yes, ma'am. CHAIRMAN CLARK: Anything else we need to 6 7 take up at this time? 8 MS. WHITE: I have one point. I've talked to I think most, if not all, of the parties today, and 9 I want to preface this by saying I don't want the 10 Commission to think that possibly we do this every 11 time, but I was canvassing the parties as to whether 12 they would be in agreement to stipulating this case 13 into the record rather than go to hearing. 14 15 I have not pushed anyone for an answer today because I understand that some people need to check 16 with their clients. I was thinking that maybe they 17 could get back to Staff whether they were agreeable or 18 not, and that way nobody would be penalized for not 19 agreeing, so to speak, so maybe Staff could take the 20 21 poll of the parties. CHAIRMAN CLARK: You mean penalized in what 22 way? I want to make it clear that if any party wants 23 a hearing and wants the ability to cross examine 24 people, now is the time to do it. But if there is, 25

you know, no need to do that, we should certainly 1 stipulate. I don't hold it against people to do that. 2 3 MS. WHITE: I didn't want -- penalize is too strong of a word. I just didn't want to --4 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Taint. 5 Taint. I didn't want anybody to 6 MS. WHITE: 7 feel bad about not saying yes to stipulating it in. So I was just thinking if maybe when everybody has had 8 a chance to talk to their client, they can talk to 9 10 either Mr. Cox or Ms. Barone and let them know what they have decided, maybe by the middle of next week. 11 12 CHAIRMAN CLARK: I guess we should check with the attorneys that work by the hour and see if it 13 is acceptable to them. 14 MS. BARONE: Chairman Clark, I would add, 15 Staff would need to take a look at the information we 16 have now to make sure we don't have questions also. 17 That's fine. I would just 18 CHAIRMAN CLARK: 19 suggest you canvass the parties and keep in touch with Staff and let them know whether or not we can 20 21 stipulate it and that way we don't need to have people 22 come here. 23 MS. WEISKE: I think a few of us can respond now and it might be helpful to hear what we have to 24 25 say.
