Issue 2: Should the Commission order BellSouth to revise its standardised high toll letter to specifically state that service will be interrupted if payment is not received by the date due?

Recommendation: Yes. BellSouth should be ordered to revise its current high toll letter to specifically state that the customer's service will be interrupted if payment is not received by the date due. This recommended revision will eliminate any customer confusion regarding the purpose of the high toll letter and will better provide the notice required by Rule 25-4.113(1)(e), F.A.C.

Issue 3: Should this docket be closed?

Recommendation: Yes. If no person whose substantial interests are affected by the Commission's proposed agency action in Issue 2 files a request for a Section 120.57, F.S., hearing within 21 days, this docket should be closed.
