## DIRECT STATEMENT

CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: State your name and address for the record.

WITHESS BELOTE: Monte Belote. My name is
Monte Belote. I'm the executive director of the
Florida Consumer Action Network. I live in Tampa.
Our office address, 4100 West Kennedy, Suite 128 in
Tampa.

We wanted just to highlight having traveled the state as the Commissioners themselves have as well, talking several months ago with one overarching concern: Customers were concerned that they should not be paying for the problems at Crystal River 3's outages. I think that as a result, that message has been heard loud and clear. FCAN's organizers and grassroots members from Orlando through Brooksville have turned out, and you've had wonderful public comment over this process. We have today more than 100 letters that have been gathered that our attorney, Lou Putney, has gestured to you we'd like to enter formally into the correspondence side of the docket.

We also brought -- although I can't have two

hands at once -- but this petition alone would span from here to the other side of the room. And those are signed petitions asking primarily to make sure that Florida Power has the responsibility to fix the problems at Crystal River 3 and not Florida's customers.

That message again has resonated across the state, and as a result, with the thanks of what we believe to be a dream team of Florida's consumer advocates, ranging from the Office of Public Counsel, the Attorney General, right down to local homeowners associations and folks that we know that are planning to be here today for public comment, have all joined unanimously to provide a good sounding board and an opportunity to provide a proper settlement and literally an opportunity to bring goodwill back to the table.

We're proud of the responsibility that

Florida Power Corporation has taken forth in the last
couple of weeks, and ultimately providing to take the
responsibility for fixing the concerns of customers,
first and foremost, but more importantly to provide
the safe and efficient use of the nuclear capabilities
at Crystal River 3.

We have one more presentation that probably

is not quite prudent yet, and since prudence has always been a part of of this case from the beginning, we certainly wouldn't want to let the cat out of the bag, but at the appropriate time later this morning we would like to join Florida Power to have a more informal presentation of the stipulation, and the wonderful historic-making opportunity to put behind the differences and bring forward the ability to cover both Florida Power's financial concerns and customers' concerns through the stipulation that is proposed before you today.

We all work for the people. And the people showed, through their effort and their turning out at the hearings and their correspondence and their effort and their labor, that the people have the power. And
