- RESPONSE: (a) Yes. MediaOne requested and uses Interim Number Portability in Florida. BellSouth believes MediaOne either now does business or has done business in Florida under the names AlterNet and/or Continental Cable. BellSouth's earlier response showed Alternet as one of the users of Interim Number Portability in Florida.
- (b) BellSouth believes MediaOne either now does business or has done business in Florida as Alternet and/or Continental Fiber. BellSouth's earlier response showed Continental Fiber as having requested and been provided two (2) foreign directory listings in Florida.
- (c) No. MediaOne's agreement for its directory listings is with BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. under a side agreement with BAPCO contained therein. BAPCO believes this agreement with MediaOne to be applicable to all states in BellSouth's nine-state region. Other local service providers in Florida have entered into nine-state agreements directly with BAPCO.

**REQUEST:** Give a description of Data Reach Advanced Intelligent Network (AIN) Service.

**RESPONSE:** This service provides single number access to an enhanced service provider's data network. Based upon the wire center where the call originates, the call will be forwarded to a subscriber-designated location within the originating LATA. Such access will allow data service providers to offer more ubiquitous access to their data networks with all transport charges billed to the data service provider rather than to the calling party.

This service is tariffed in all nine states.

**REQUEST:** Billing detail information regarding directory assistance services provided through resale that BellSouth provides to ALECs, for each of the three service options listed in the SGAT in VII.B.2.a, VII.B.2.b, and VII.B.2.c.

**RESPONSE:** The three service options discussed in the SGAT in VII.B.2.a, VII.B.2.b and VII.B.2.c are used by facilities based Alternative Local Exchange Companies (ALECs) rather than resellers. Such facilities based companies will typically have their own local switches and may acquire from BellSouth one or more of the options named. Following is a brief description of a typical use of each option:

a. **Directory Assistance Access Service:** A facilities based ALEC provides its own local switching but not its own directory assistance platform or directory assistance operators. Such a facilities based ALEC might choose to acquire Directory Assistance Access Service from BellSouth and route calls to directory assistance (411, for example) over a trunk group from the ALEC's local switch to the BellSouth directory assistance platform where those calls would be answered by BellSouth directory assistance operators. In this option, BellSouth bills the ALEC a per message charge.

b. **Direct Access Directory Assistance Service:** A facilities based ALEC provides its own local switch, its own directory assistance platform and its own directory assistance operators but not its own directory assistance database of directory listings. Such a facilities based ALEC might choose to acquire Direct Access Directory Assistance Service such that its directory assistance operators (through the ALEC's directory assistance platform which would be connected "on-line" to the BellSouth directory assistance database) could retrieve directory assistance information for the ALEC's end user customers. In this option, BellSouth bills the ALEC for on-line access to the database.

c. **Directory Assistance Database Service:** A facilities based ALEC provides its own local switch, its own directory assistance platform and its own directory assistance operators but not its own directory assistance database of directory listings. Such a facilities based ALEC might choose to acquire Direct Access Database Service such that its directory assistance operators (through the ALEC's directory assistance platform which would be connected to the ALEC's directory assistance database which in turn would be periodically updated from the BellSouth directory assistance database) could retrieve directory assistance information for the ALEC's end user customers. The primary difference between Direct Access Directory Assistance Service (DADAS) described earlier and Directory Assistance Database Service (DADS) is that DADAS is "on-line" access to the BellSouth directory assistance database while DADS is a periodic "snapshot" of the contents of the BellSouth directory assistance database. In this option, BellSouth bills the ALEC for updates to its database when they are requested.

In the resale environment, when an ALEC's end user customer dials directory assistance (for example, by dialing 411) the billing information (that is, identification of calling customer, time of day, etc.) would be recorded by the BellSouth switch and later transferred to the Daily Usage File which would in turn be periodically sent to the appropriate ALEC according to the transfer cycle requested by the ALEC. Following is an excerpt from the Resale Ordering Guide dated June 19, 1997, Section 1, Page 1-17:

"All daily usage file messages will be in the standard Bellcore EMR record format. Messages to be transmitted may include, but are not limited to:

Per use/per activation services (Three Way Calling, Verify, Interrupt, Call Return, etc.)  
Billable Measured IntraLATA Local Calls  
Directory Assistance Messages  
IntraLATA Toll  
WATS & 800 Service"
