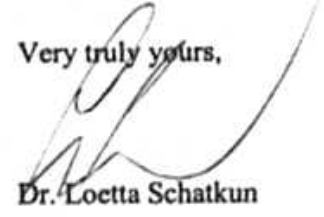

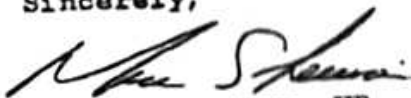

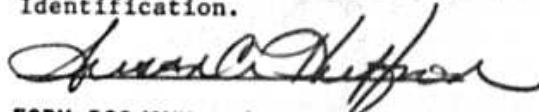

SECTION 2 - RULES, REGULATIONS AND SERVICE QUALITY CRITERIA

2.1 Undertaking of E.T. I. Communications, Inc. - E.T.I. Communications, Inc., undertakes to provide local telephone service to customers in accordance with this price list and in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the FPSC and any other agency claiming jurisdiction as from time to time may be amended.

2.2 Limitations - The service provided by E.T.I. Communications hereunder, shall be limited to local telephone service. E.T.I. Communications, Inc. has a limited installation staff and will therefore, up to fifty percent of the time rely upon contracted installers and service personnel to fulfill its obligations to its customers.

2.3 Liabilities of The Company - E.T.I. Communications shall use its best efforts to provide local telephone service to its customers, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In the event a customer whose service has not been suspended or terminated encounters a service problem, the company shall on a best efforts basis, endeavor to restore the customers service as soon as possible. The liability of the company shall be limited to reimbursement of the out of service time. The out of service time shall be calculated by taking the monthly service charge and dividing it by the number of hours of no service. E.T.I. Communications, Inc. shall have no further liability.

2.4. Service Availability - Local telephone service will be available to customers 24 hours every day of the year, subject to Acts of God, Breakdowns, Equipment Failure and circumstances beyond the reasonable control of E.T. I. Communications, Inc.

2.5 Interruption of Service - Service will be interrupted when a customer fails to pay a bill within seven days of its due date, or by exceeding a pre determined credit limit, and not curing the over limit amount within 48 hours after requested by US Mail. The due date of regular telephone service bills shall be ten days after the bill has been mailed by dropping in a US Postal Service Mail Box or by delivery to a Post Office. Monthly service shall be a calendar month.

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2.6 Deposits and Advance Payments - E.T.I. shall have the right to request a despot equal to one month of service, or up to three months of service, depending upon the credit worthiness of the customer. Deposits shall be held in an interest bearing account at current savings account interest rates. Interest shall be for the benefit of the customer. Deposits shall be returned to the customer after the customer has paid 12 consecutive bills in a timely fashion.

2.7. Taxes - E.T.I. Communications, Inc., shall collect from its customers as appropriate and pay to the proper government taxing agency all Federal, state and local taxes due and owing for the services provided by E.T. I. Communications, Inc. as may be changed from time to time.

2.8 Employee Concessions - E.T. I. Employees shall be entitled to receive local telephone service from E.T.I. Communications, Inc. for the duration of their employment for one half the cost of the current published price for that particular service.

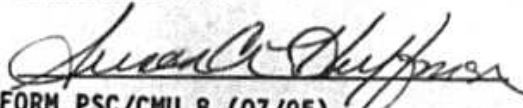
